Health Snippet – Avocado

Health Benefits of Avocado (Seek Medical Advice)

Avocado is a single-seeded fruit from the *Persea americana* tree. Native to Mexico and Central America, this "alligator pear" green-to-black bumpy skin & thick pulp. Due to savoury flavour it's used in salads.

A 7-ounce (201-gram) avocado provides: Calories: 322, Fat: 30g, Protein: 4g, Carbs: 17g, Fiber: 14g, Vit C: 22%, Vit E: 28%, Vit K: 35%, Vit B2: 20%, Vit B3: 22%, Vit B5: 56%, Vit B6: 40%, Folate: 41%, Magnesium: 14%, Potassium: 21%, Copper: 42%, Manganese: 12%, etc...

Heart Health: Rich in oleic acid helps lower LDL ("bad") cholesterol while maintaining HDL ("good") cholesterol.

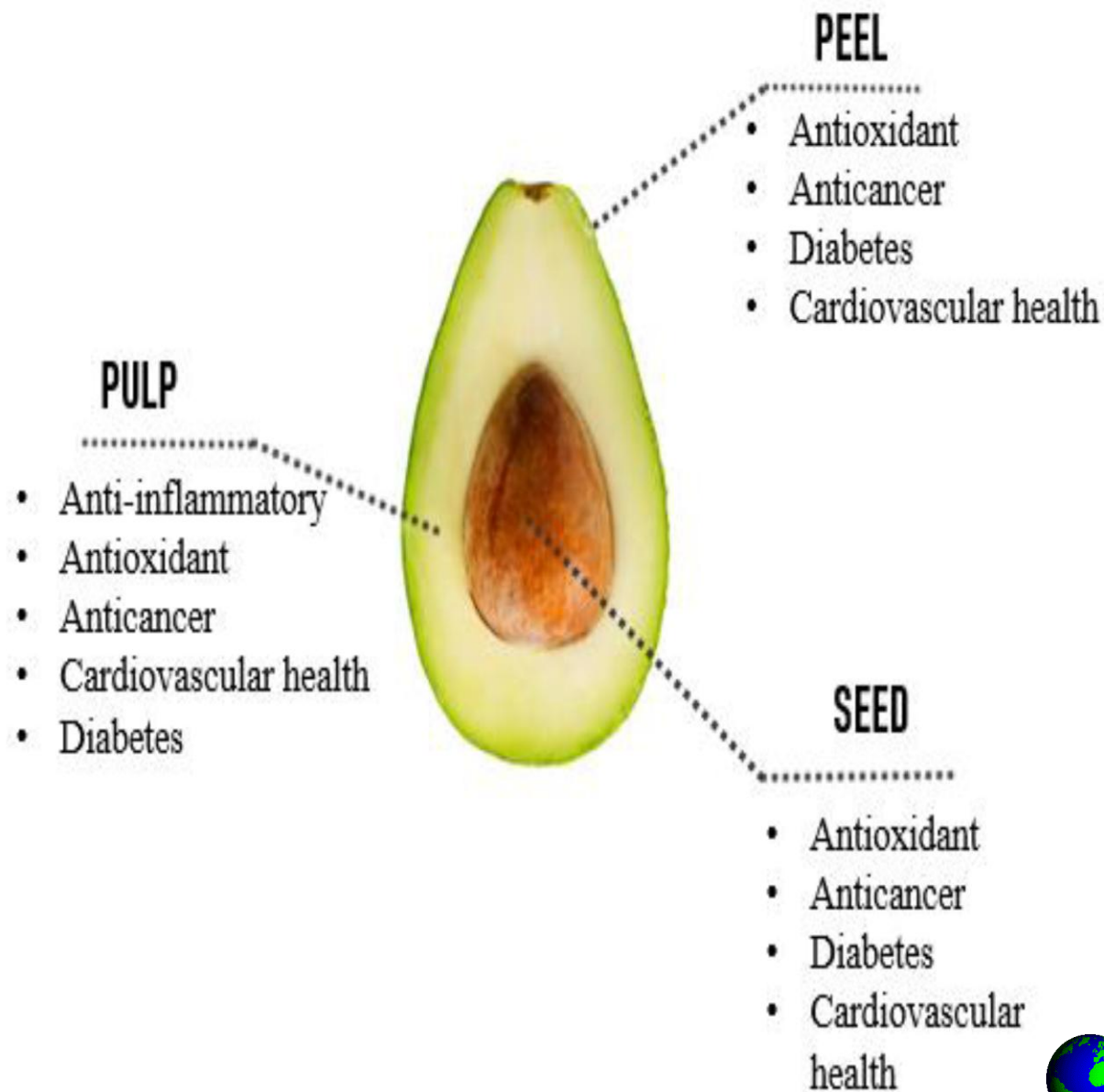

Introduction

The Expansion of the Kingdom to All Nations: While focusing initially on the house of Israel, Jesus demonstrates that salvation is for all people through faith, highlighted by his healing of the Canaanite woman's daughter ([Matt 15:21-28](#)).

The Nature of True Faith and Righteousness: Jesus contrasts internal, genuine faith with external religious rituals ([Matt 15:1-20](#)). He highlights the "great faith" of marginalized outsiders (like the Canaanite woman) over the lack of understanding of his disciples and religious leaders.

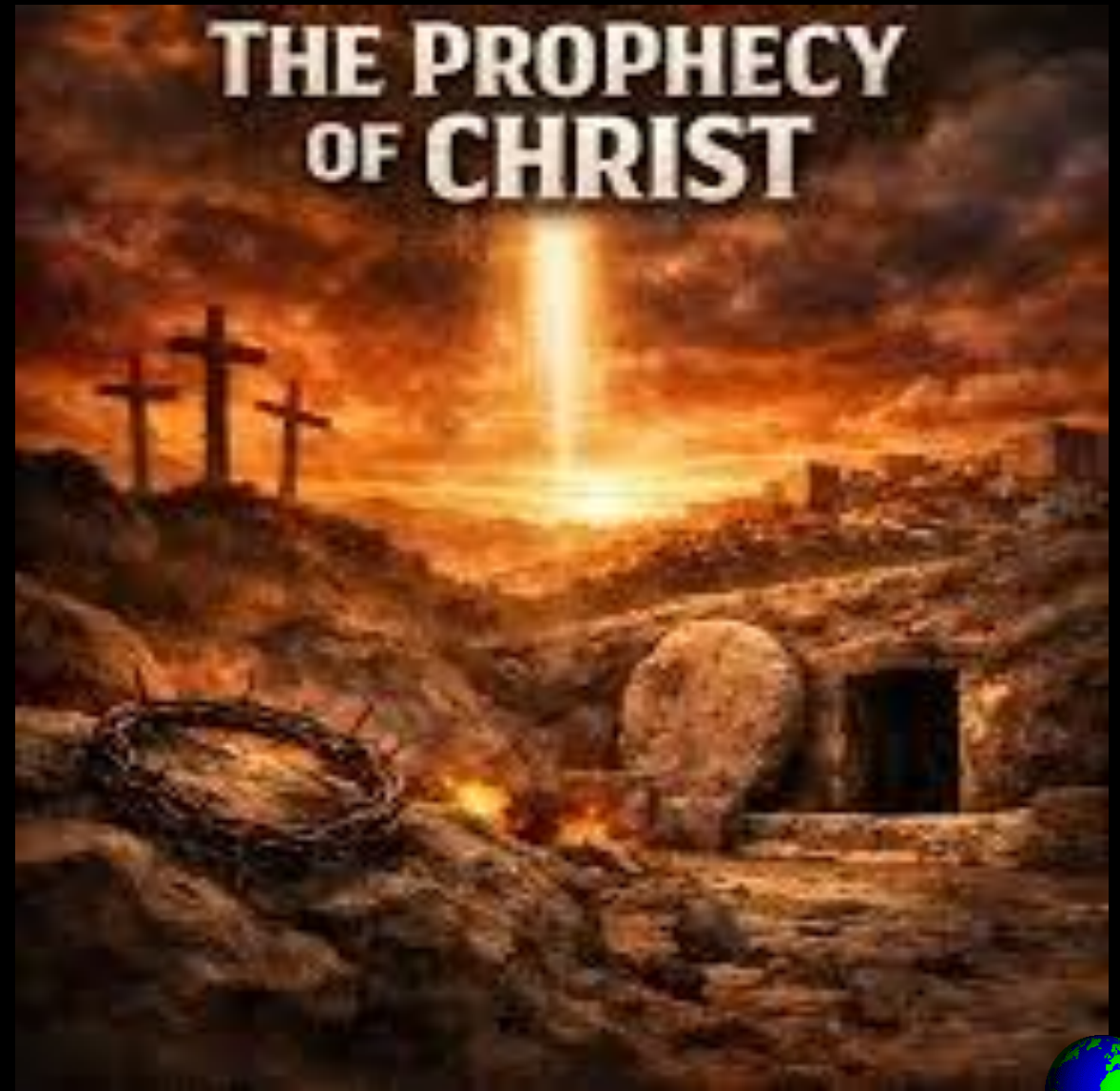

Introduction

The Suffering Messiah (The Passion Narrative): A major thematic shift occurs as Jesus explicitly predicts his rejection, suffering, death, and resurrection, redefining Messianic expectations ([Matt 16:21](#), [17:22-23](#), [20:17-19](#)).

The Redefinition of Community: Jesus establishes the church ([Matt 16:18](#)) and sets new standards for his followers, emphasizing humility, service, and forgiveness rather than striving for greatness ([Matt 20:25-28](#), [18:1-35](#)).

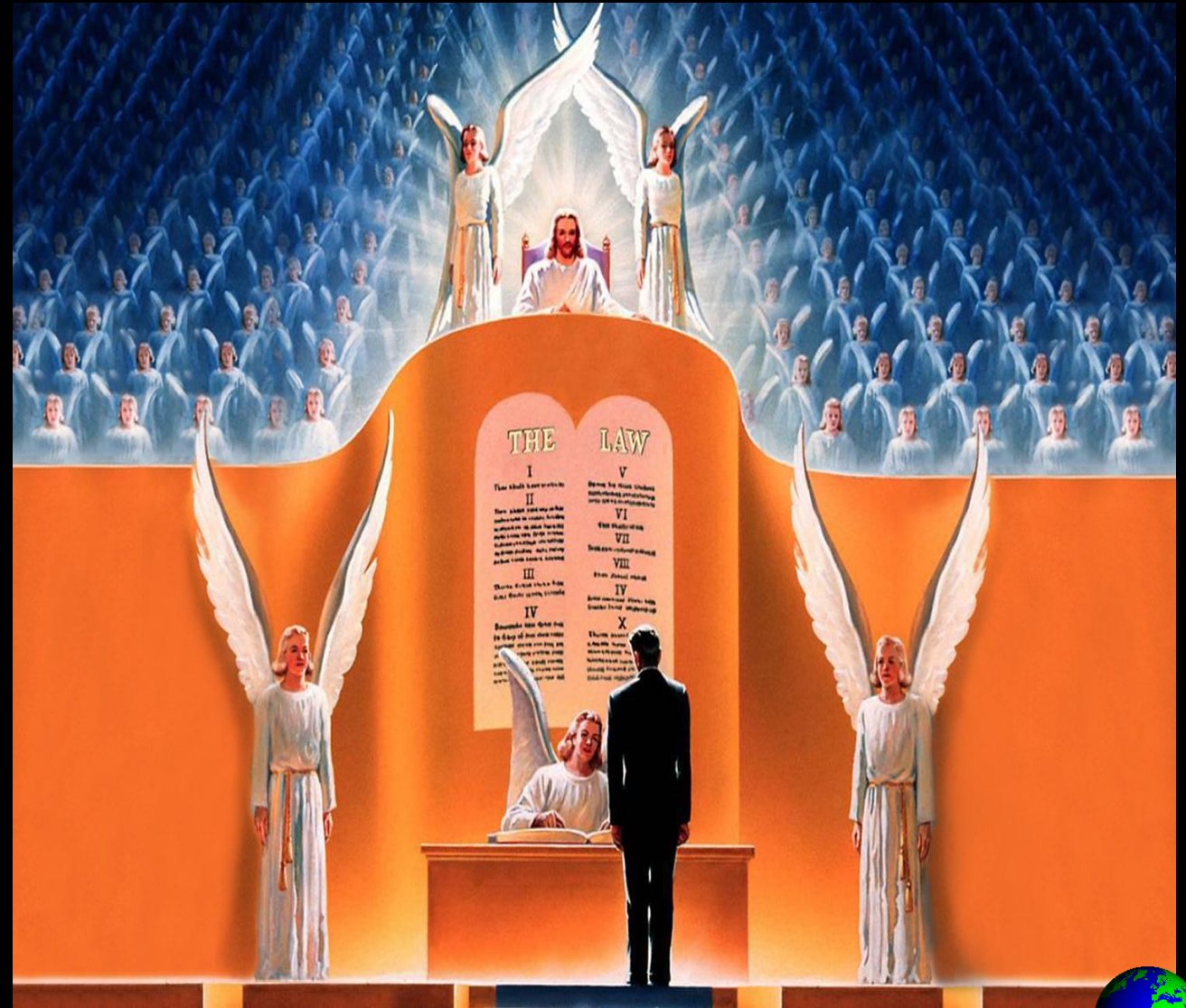


Introduction

Final Judgment and Authority:

The closing chapters focus on the end times, judgment, and Jesus' absolute authority in heaven and on earth ([Matt 24-25](#), [28:18](#)), culminating in the commission to make disciples of all nations ([Matt 28:19](#)).

These chapters move from testing the Pharisees' tradition ([15](#)) toward the climax of the cross ([26-27](#)) and the vindication of his authority in the Resurrection and Commission ([28](#)).

Conflict Over Tradition and Internal Purity

(Ch. 15): Jesus rebukes the Pharisees for prioritizing oral tradition over God's law, emphasizing that defilement comes from the heart, not ceremonial handwashing. He demonstrates God's grace extends beyond Israel by healing the Canaanite woman's daughter, highlighting her great faith.

The Messiahship and the Church (Ch. 16-

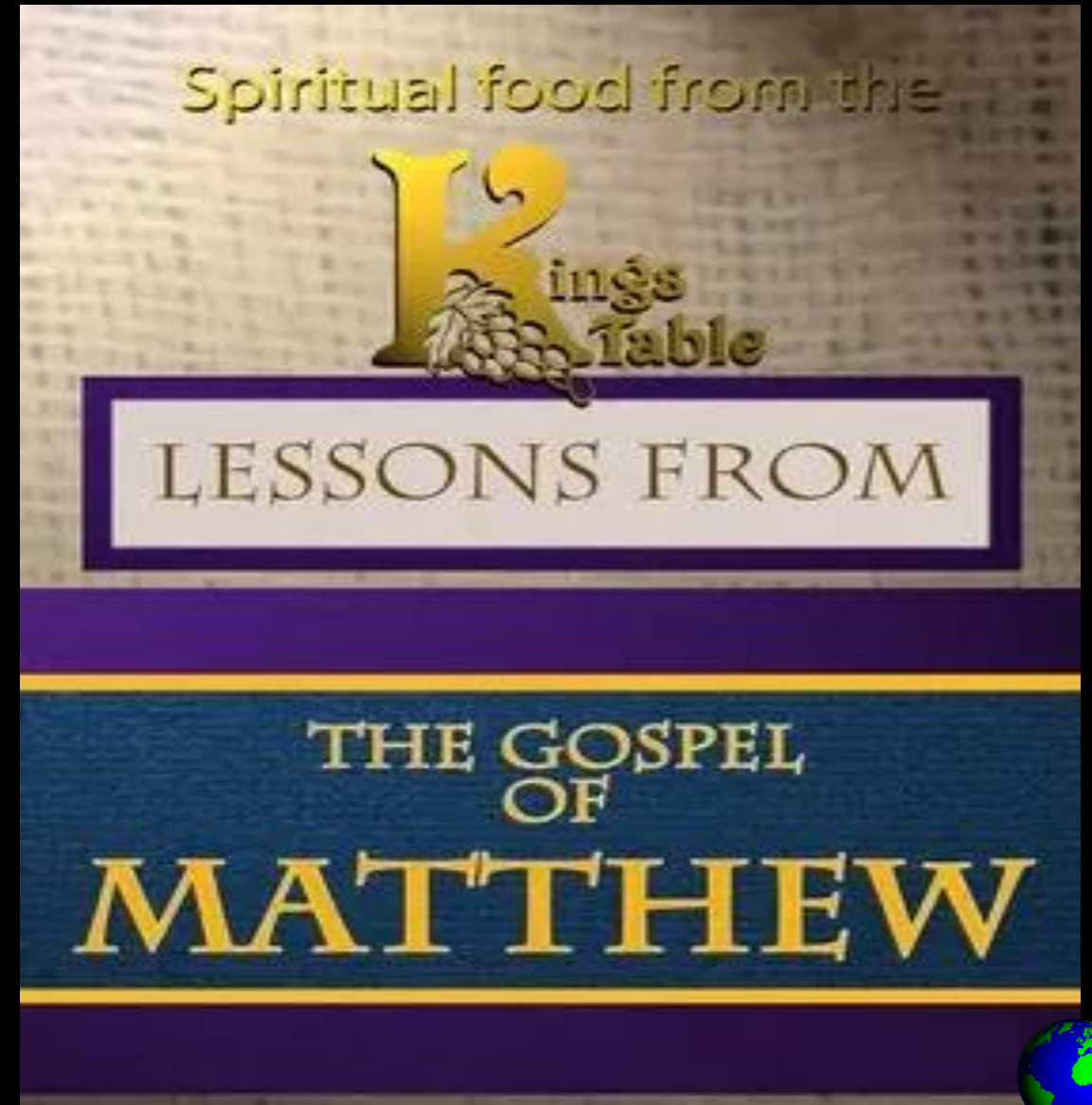
17): Peter confesses Jesus as the Christ. Jesus reveals his upcoming death and resurrection, teaches about the nature of the church, and is transfigured, confirming his divinity.

Humility, Forgiveness, and Kingdom Living (Ch. 18-20): Jesus teaches the necessity of childlike humility, church discipline, and the parable of the unforgiving servant, emphasizing the need for mercy.

Jerusalem, Authority, and Judgment (Ch. 21-23): Jesus makes his triumphal entry, cleanses the temple (displaying righteous indignation), and explicitly challenges the authority of religious leaders through parables, leading to a severe condemnation of hypocrites (Matt 23).



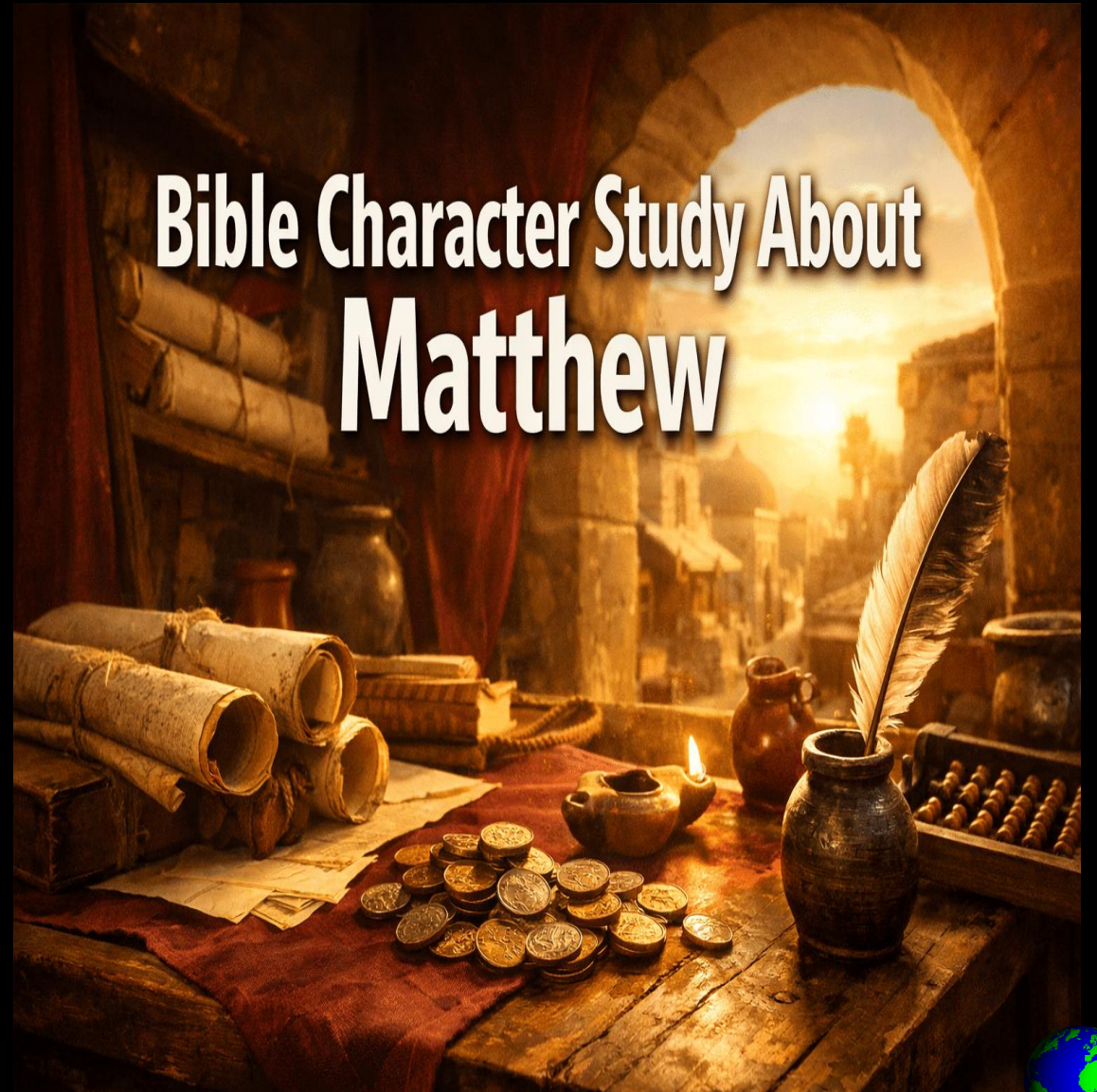

The Olivet Discourse: End-Time

Prophecy (Ch. 24-25): Jesus describes the destruction of Jerusalem and the signs of his Second Coming, urging vigilance, faithfulness, and mission (parable of the talents, virgins, and sheep and goats).

The Passion and Crucifixion (Ch. 26-

27): Jesus is anointed in Bethany, shares the Passover (Lord's Supper), is betrayed by Judas, denied by Peter, and subjected to a mock trial before being crucified, fulfilling prophecy as the Lamb of God.



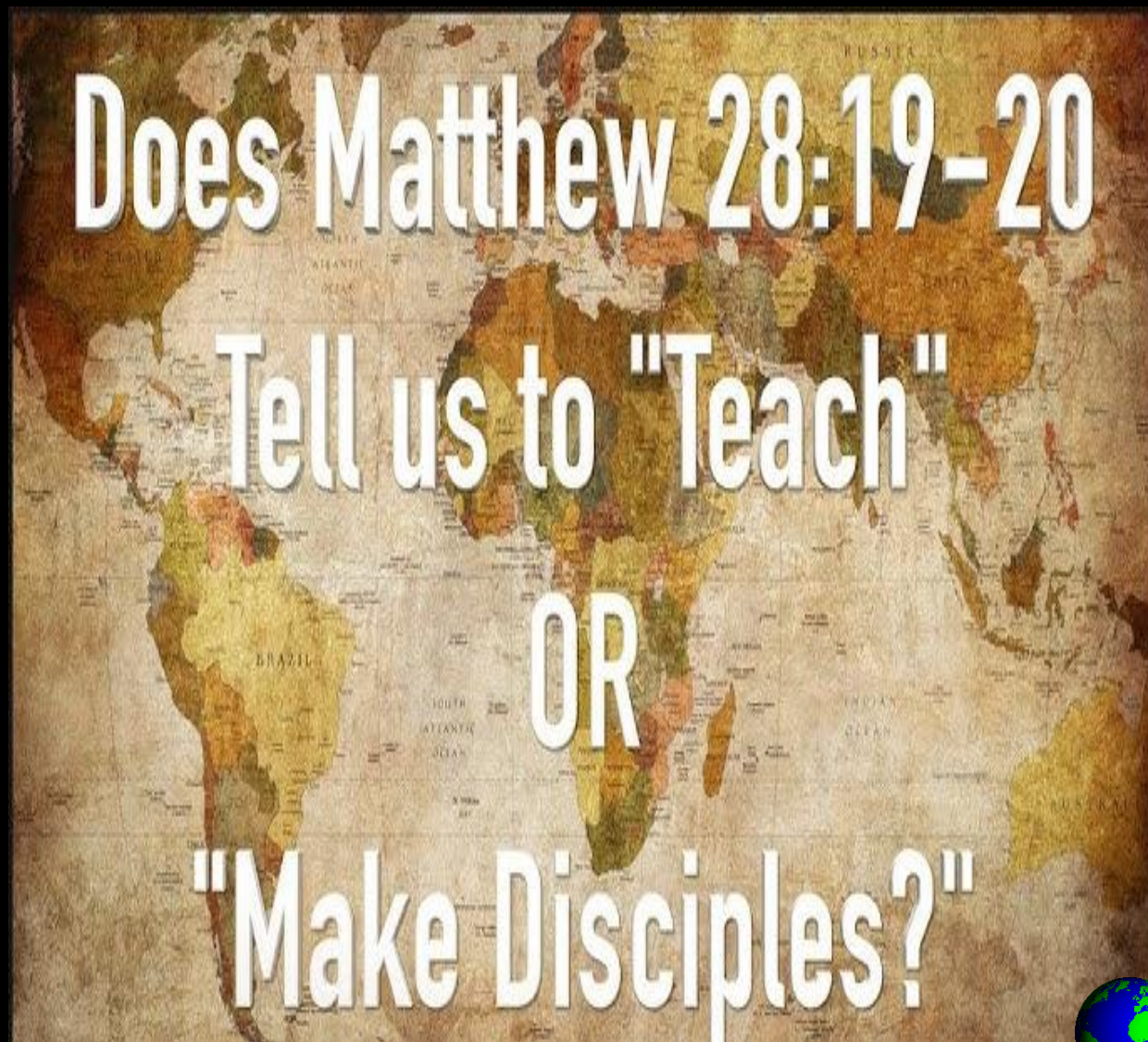

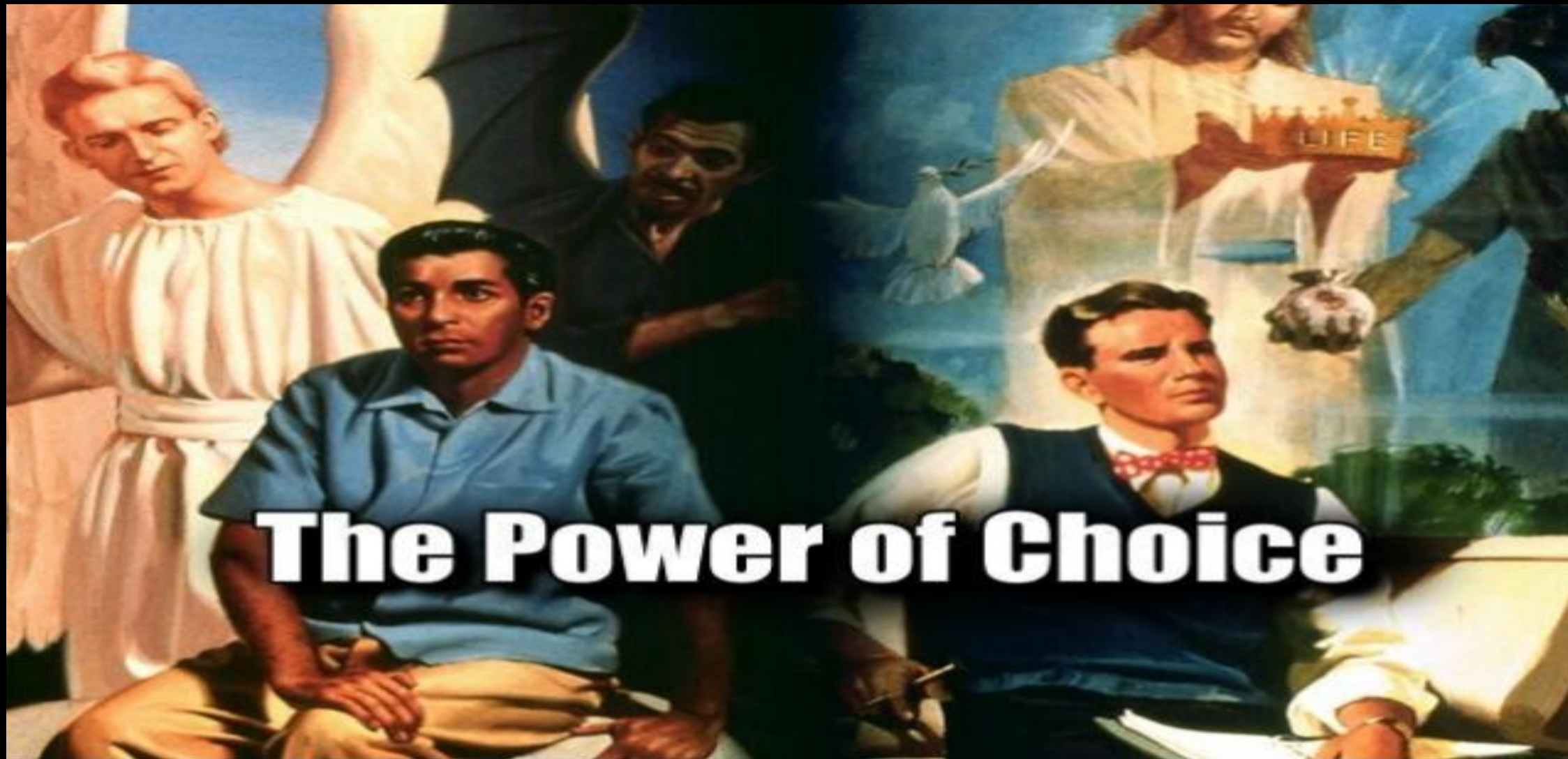
Conclusion

Resurrection and the Great Commission (Ch. 28): Jesus rises from the dead on the first day of the week (having rested on the Sabbath), meets the disciples in Galilee, and issues the Great Commission to preach the Gospel to all nations.

The book summarizes Jesus' role as the true Messiah, the breaking down of walls between Jews and Gentiles, the Sabbath, and the Olivet discourse as crucial for end-time prophecy.

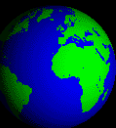
