High in Antioxidants: helps neutralize free radicals and reduce oxidative stress.

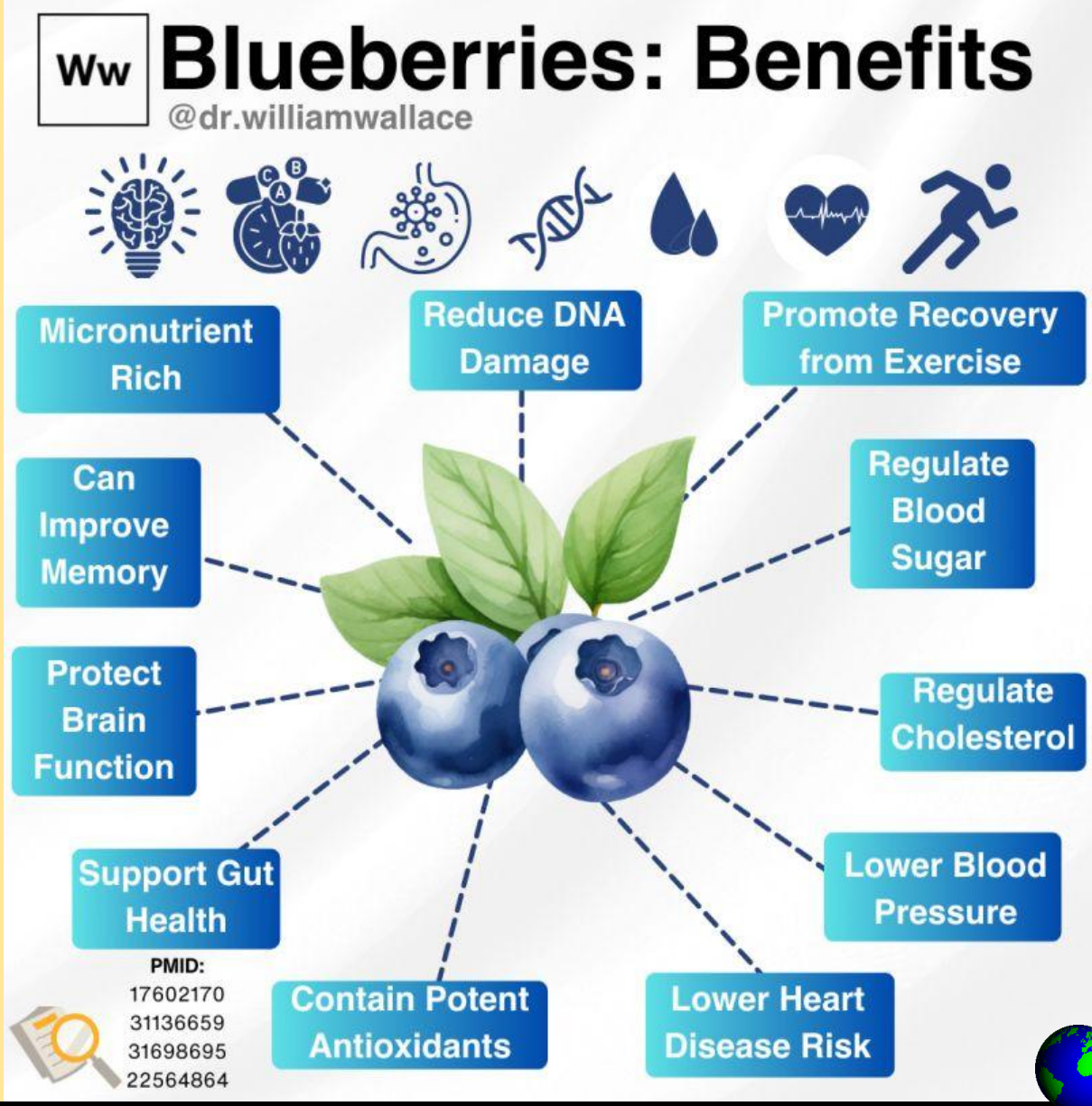
Cardiovascular Health: helps lower blood pressure, improves cholesterol levels & reduced arterial stiffness.

Brain Function & Memory: flavonoids help delay age-related cognitive decline and support brain health and development of cancers.

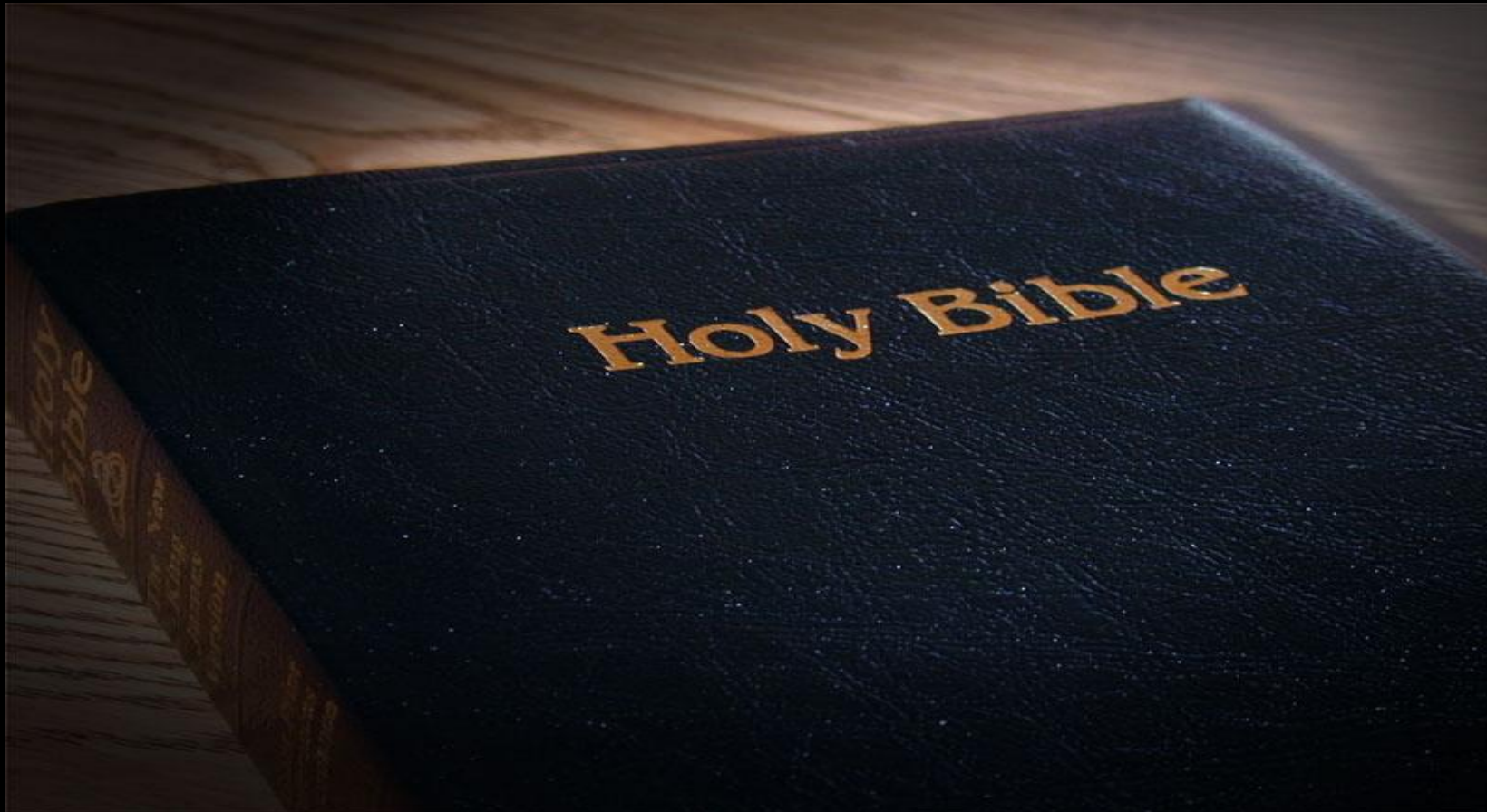
Blood Sugar Regulation: high fiber content & flavonoids improve insulin sensitivity, making them a great fruit choice for managing or preventing type 2 diabetes.

Exercise Recovery: The anti-inflammatory properties of polyphenols can speed up muscle repair and ease exercise-induced muscle soreness.

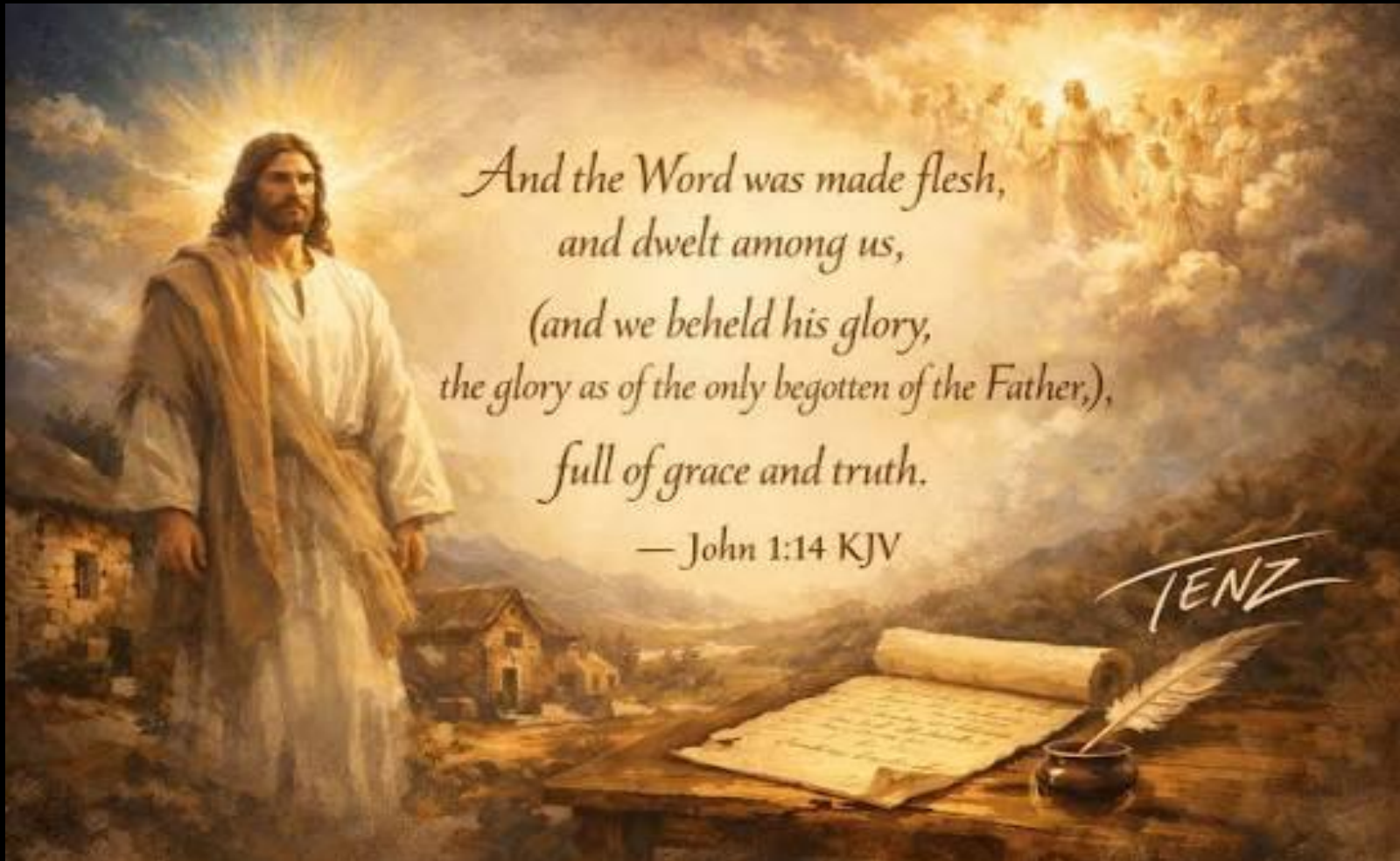

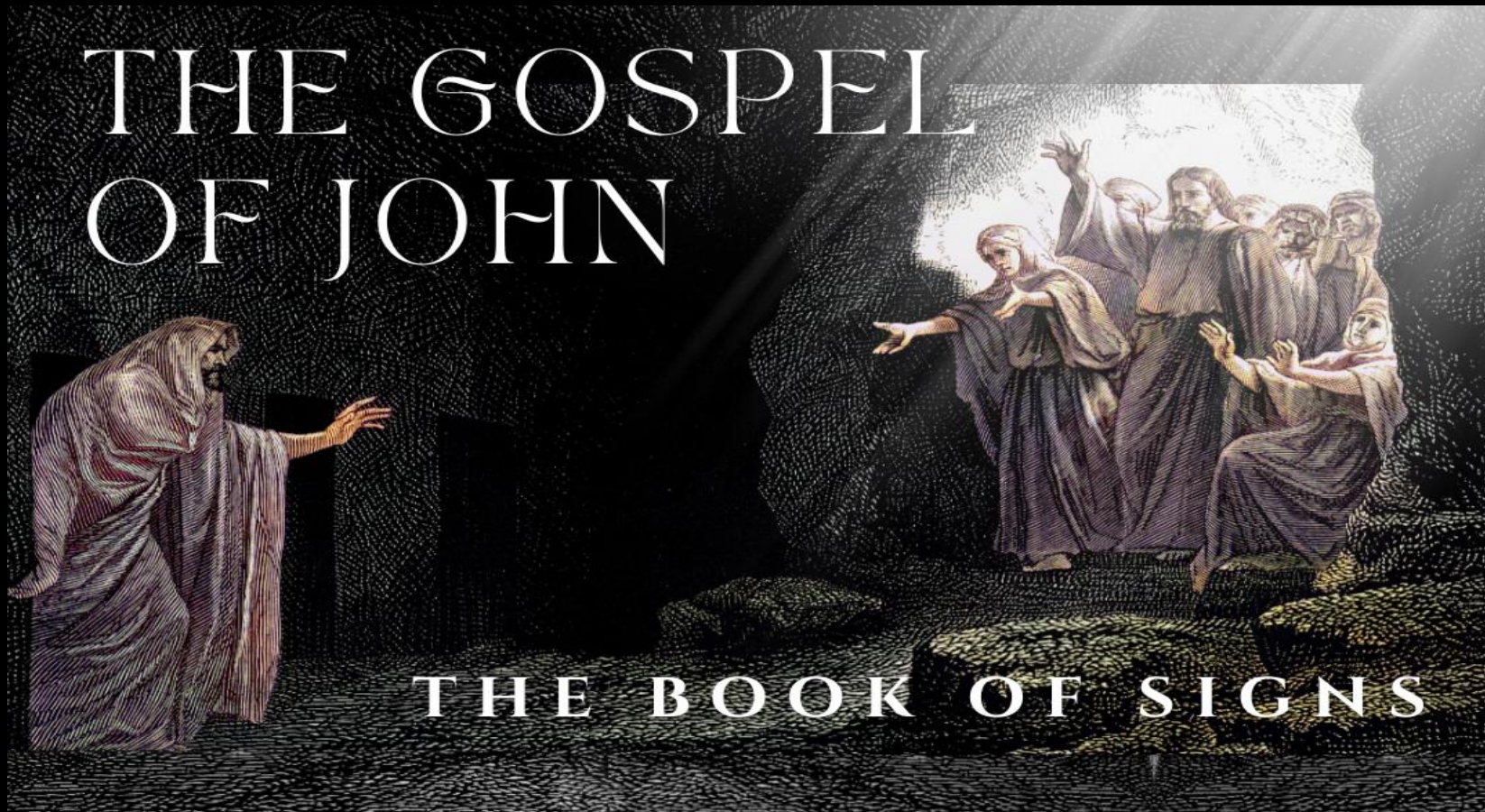

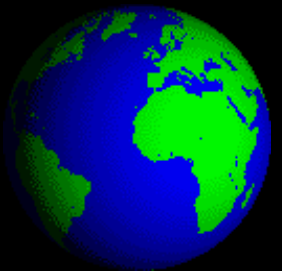

Introduction

1. The Divine Identity (The Creator Rejected)

The Logos: The Bible Commentary identifies the "Word" (Logos) as the pre-existent, co-eternal Son of God. Jesus was not just a prophet, but the Creator entering His own physical universe.

The Tragedy: The rejection spoken of in [John 1:11](#) goes deeper than just an historical rejection by the Jewish religious leaders. It represents humanity rejecting its own Maker and Source of life.



Introduction

2. *The Tragedy of Israel ("His Own")*

Chosen Heritage: God had carefully nurtured the nation of Israel for centuries. They were uniquely positioned to recognize the Messiah.

Spiritual Blindness: By allowing tradition, legalism, and secularization to cloud their spiritual vision, the nation as a whole failed to welcome Him when He appeared in human form.



Introduction

3. Grace vs. Human Free Will (The Universal Choice)

Rejecting the Light: John's prologue builds on the theme that where there is light, there is a choice. Rejection is an active choice made by a fallen humanity that prefers darkness to avoid the conviction of truth.

The Promise: "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God." Salvation relies on individual reception rather than mere national or familial lineage.

3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

1. Navigating Widespread Rejection (John 1:11)

In [John 1:11](#), "He came unto his own, and his own received him not", acts as a mirror for the last-day remnant.

Just as the Jewish religious establishment rejected Christ due to spiritual blindness, the remnant often faces rejection from the broader world and even compromised religious institutions.

The Takeaway: Believers are called to hold fast to Christ, remembering that faithful witness will not always be universally accepted ([John 15:18](#))



3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

2. Power of the Living Word over Traditions (John 2 & 4)

In [John 2](#) (Cleansing the temple) and [John 4](#) (The Samaritan woman at the well), Jesus supersedes rigid, man-made religious traditions with truth and the Holy Spirit.

The Takeaway: The remnant is called to strip away empty formalism and embrace a "heart-religion." In the last days, the focus must shift from outward rituals to "worship him in spirit and in truth" ([John 4:23](#)).



3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

3. Total Dependence on Jesus (John 5:5-9)

At the pool of Bethesda, Jesus asks the invalid, "*Wilt thou be made whole?*" (John 5:6). The man had relied on superstition and tradition for decades, yet he needed to rely entirely on the spoken word of Christ.

The Takeaway: The remnant cannot save themselves through human effort or legalism. Spiritual healing and righteousness come entirely through surrendering to Christ.



3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

4. Remaining Steadfast Through Apostasy (John 6)

In [John 6:66](#), many of Christ's followers abandoned Him because His teachings were too difficult. Jesus then turned to the twelve and asked, "Will ye also go away?" ([John 6:67](#)).

The Takeaway: The last days will feature intense spiritual testing and apostasy. The remnant demonstrates faith not by following the crowd, but by echoing Peter's response: "Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life" ([John 6:68](#)).

5. Partaking of the Divine Nature (John 10)

Jesus identifies Himself as the Good Shepherd who knows His sheep intimately, declaring, "*I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly*" (John 10:10).

The Takeaway: The remnant is distinguished by their close, intimate walk with God. Abiding in the Shepherd gives believers the power to discern false teachings and remain secure in God's protective hand.

6. Overcoming Every "Setback" through Faith (John 11)

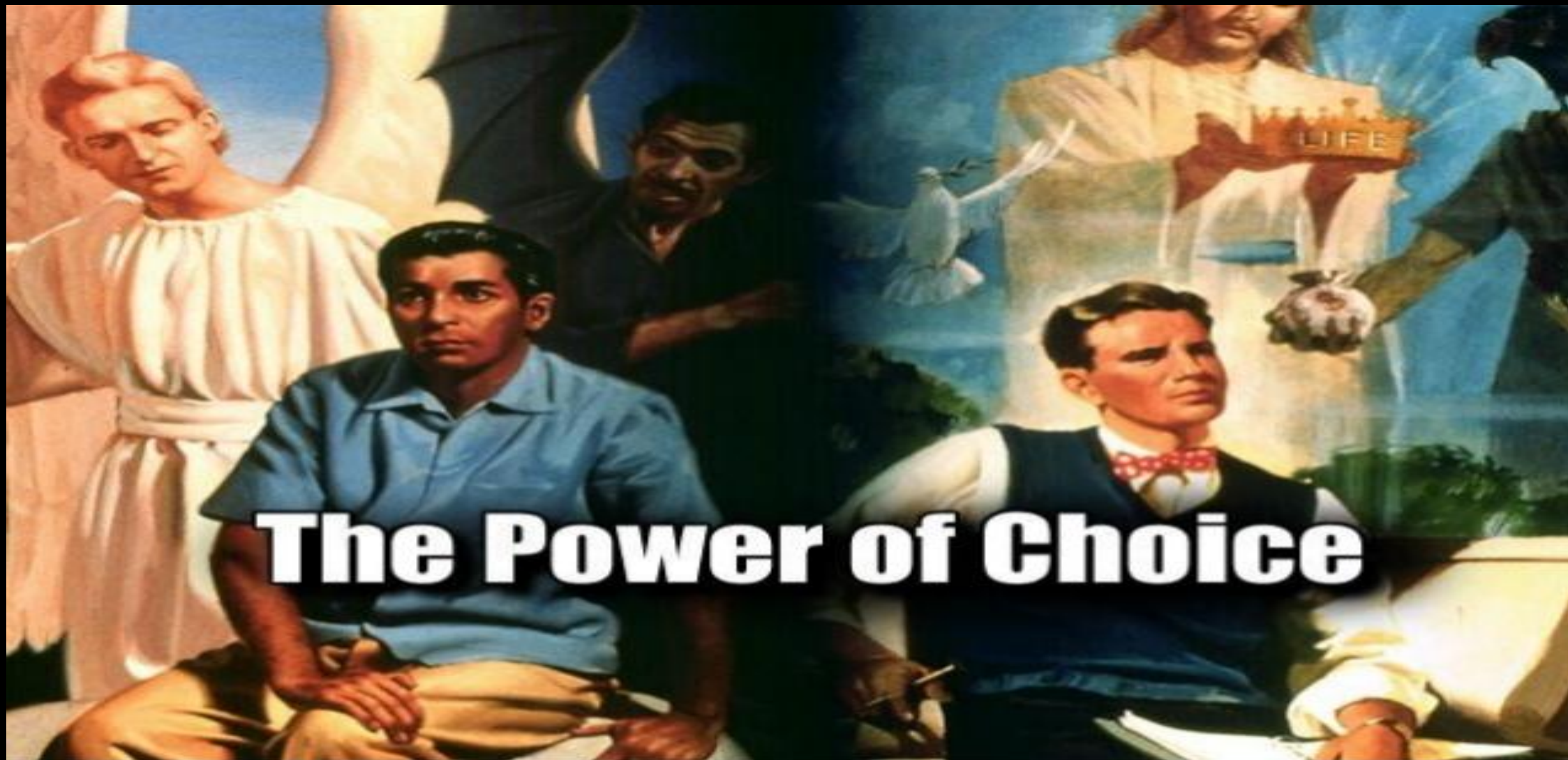
The resurrection of Lazarus illustrates that what may seem like a delay or a devastating setback to humans is an opportunity for God to reveal His glory.

The Takeaway: Though the remnant will face persecution and severe trials, they are called to trust in the ultimate resurrection and vindication found in Christ, the "resurrection, and the life" (John 11:25).

Chapters 1 to 11 of the Gospel of John provide foundational lessons for these believers, highlighting themes of rejection, restoration, and abiding trust in the Word.

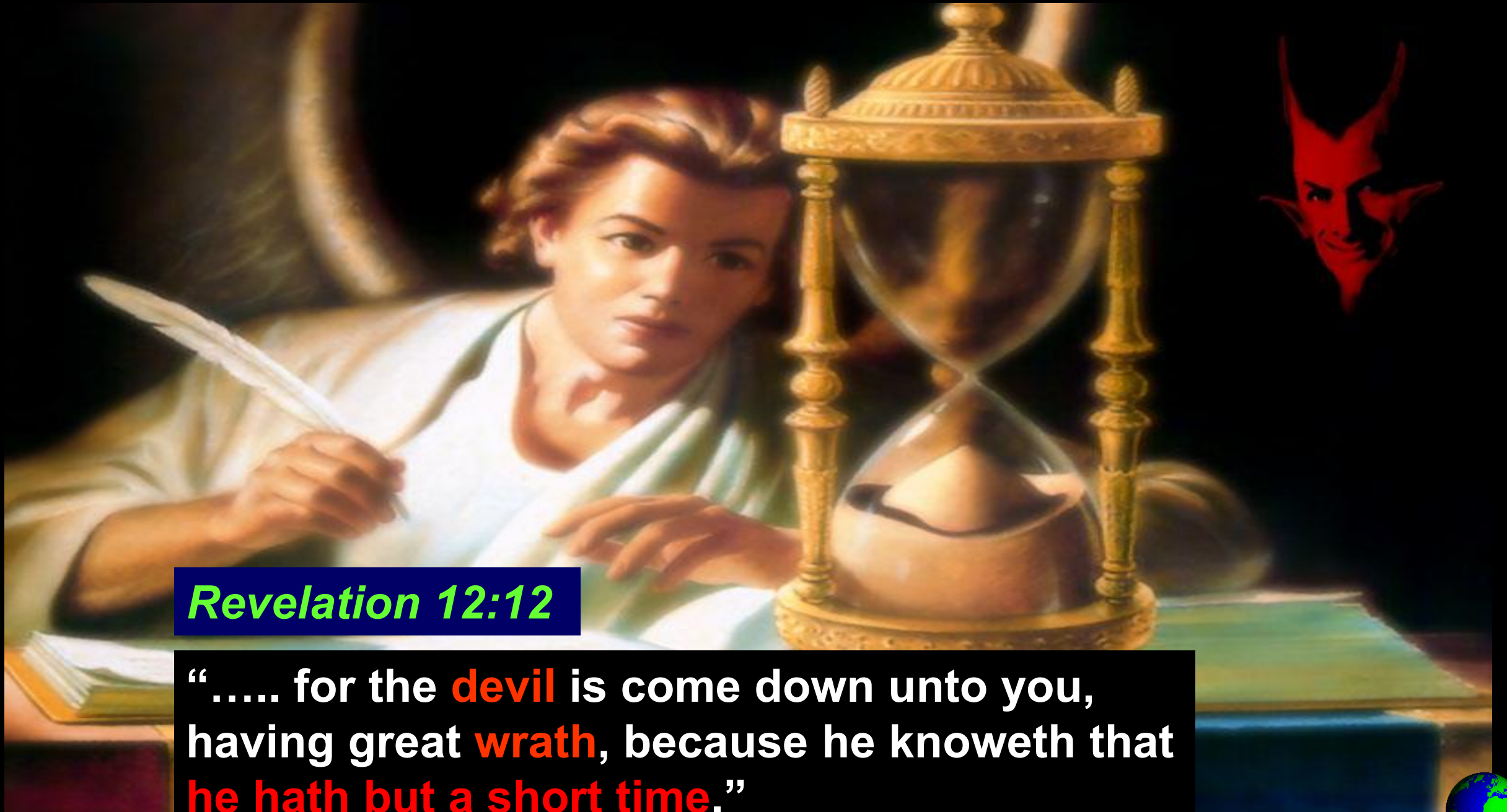
