Health Benefits of Boysenberry (Seek Medical Advice)

The boysenberry is a plump, deep maroon, complex hybrid fruit. Known for its large size, soft texture, and thin skin, it offers a rich, juicy, and sweet-tart flavor profile with a floral aroma.

Cardiovascular & Heart Health: has high potassium-to-sodium ratio and is packed with anthocyanins, which help relax blood vessels, lower blood pressure, and improve overall endothelial function.

Respiratory Support: can assist with tissue repair and reduce scar tissue in the lungs, benefiting with asthma.

Digestive Regulation: Has high levels of dietary fiber which promotes regular bowel movements, prevent constipation, and support gastrointestinal health.

Immunity & Cellular Function: high source of Vitamin C to ward off infections, and Folate (a B vitamin), which supports cell formation and prenatal health.

Side effects: if excess eaten causes digestive distress.

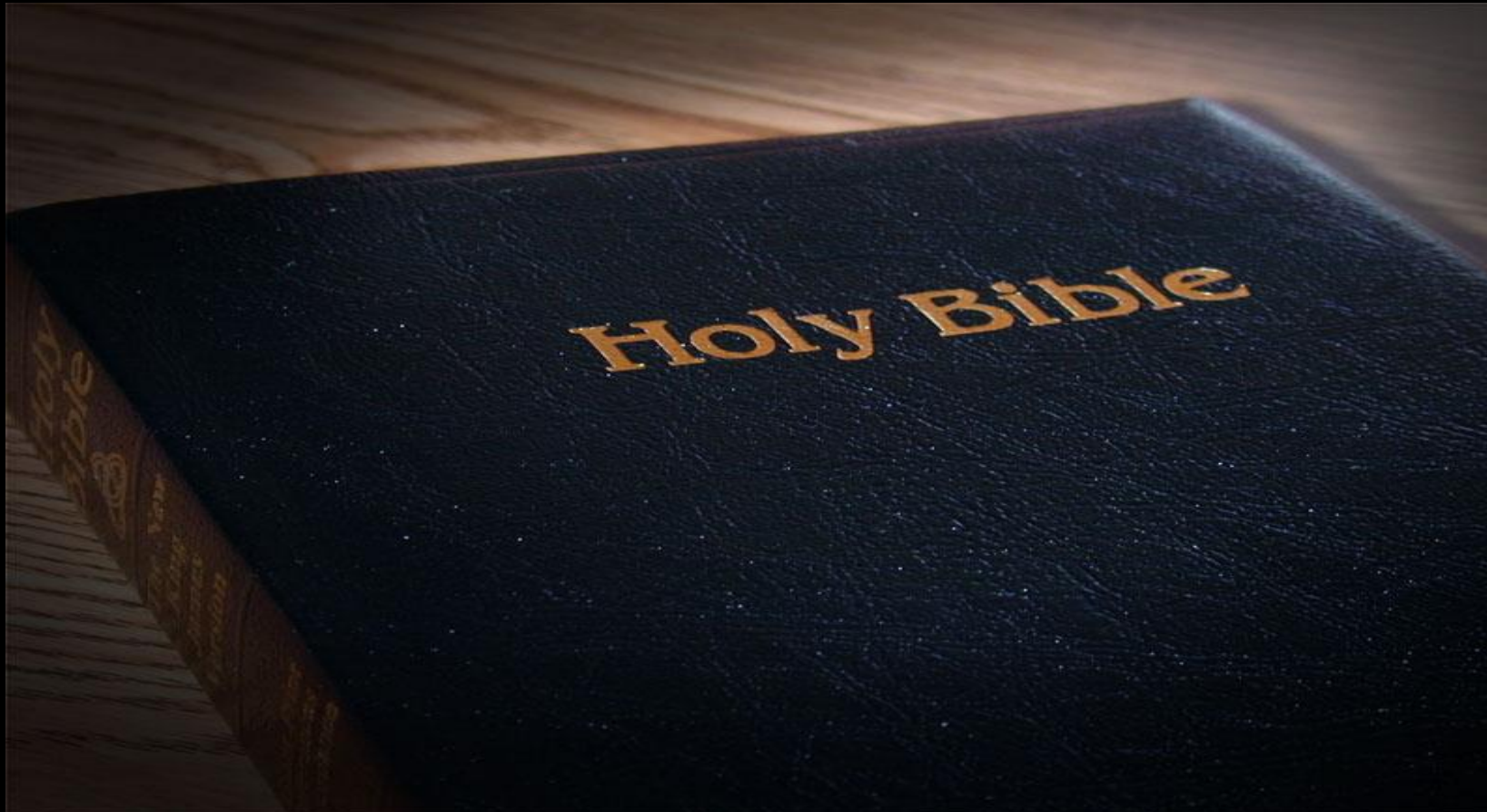

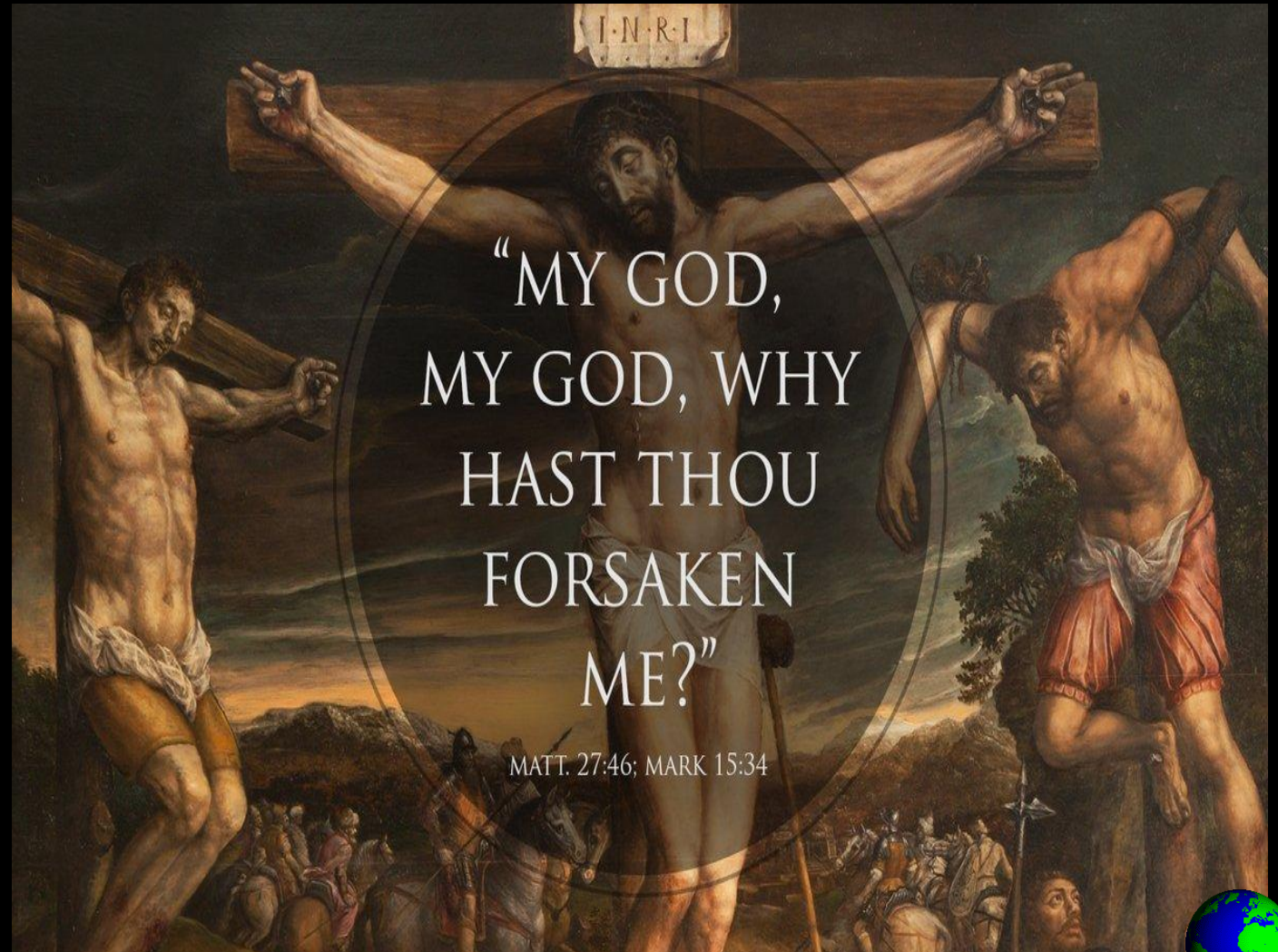


Introduction

1. The Cross as the Vindication of God (John 12–15)

The Hour of Glory: the cross is not viewed as a defeat but as the ultimate glorification of Jesus. By taking humanity's sin and dying as our substitute, Jesus unmasked Satan's character.

The Model of Self-Sacrifice: The foot-washing and the "new commandment" (John 13) emphasize servant leadership, humble submission, and a spirit of self-sacrificing love as the defining mark of the believer.

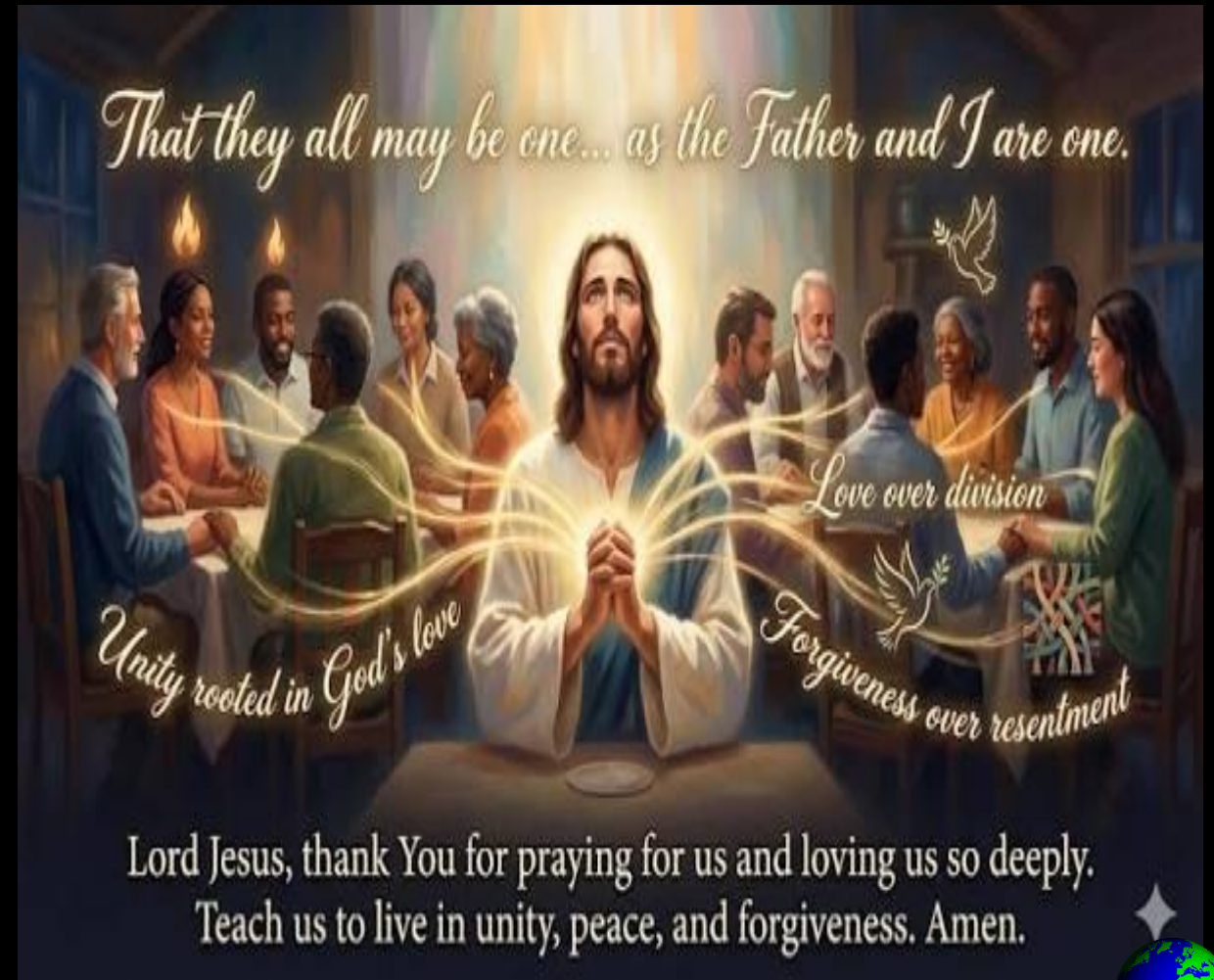
2. The High Priestly Prayer and The Holy Spirit (John 14–17)

The Comforter: Chapters 14-16

highlight the role of the Holy Spirit (the Comforter) as Christ's representative on earth, guiding the church into all truth after His ascension.

True Unity: In [John 17](#), Jesus prays for the unity of His followers, an essential SDA theme emphasizing a cohesive, truth-bound remnant preparing for the Second Coming.

Sanctification: Jesus prays, "Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth" ([John 17:17](#)). This underscores the Adventist focus on lifelong character development and moral purity through the study of Scripture.



Introduction

3. The Great Controversy in Action (John 18–19)

The Cosmic Conflict: Jesus' arrest, trials, and crucifixion form the climax of the Great Controversy between Christ and Satan.

Vindication of the Law: Jesus' voluntary submission to death vindicates God's law, proving that God is just and that His law could not be set aside, even at the cost of the Creator's life.



Introduction

4. *The Resurrection and The Remnant Mission (John 20–21)*

Victory Over Death: Jesus' literal resurrection provides the foundational hope of eternal life and the vindication of His divine identity.

The Call to Witness: In [chapter 21](#), Jesus' restoration of Peter ("Feed my sheep") emphasizes the call to ministry, pastoral care, and the global proclamation of the Gospel.

3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

John 12: The anointing at Bethany highlights the contrast between devoted worship and selfish ambition.

Jesus's "triumphal entry" fulfils prophecy, but He warns that His death is necessary for universal salvation (the "grain of wheat" analogy).

John 13: The foot-washing (ordinance of humility) establishes the necessity of mutual service and prepares the disciples for spiritual cleansing before the Lord's Supper.



3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

John 14: Jesus comforts His followers with the promise of the Second Coming ("I will come again") and introduces the Holy Spirit as the believer's "Comforter" (Counselor).

John 15: The "Vine and the Branches" underscores belief in righteousness by faith—bearing spiritual fruit is a result of total dependence on Christ, not human effort.

John 16: Jesus promises the continued guidance of the Holy Spirit to convict the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment.



3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

John 17: The High Priestly Prayer reveals Jesus's desire for the unity of the church, set apart from worldly influences.

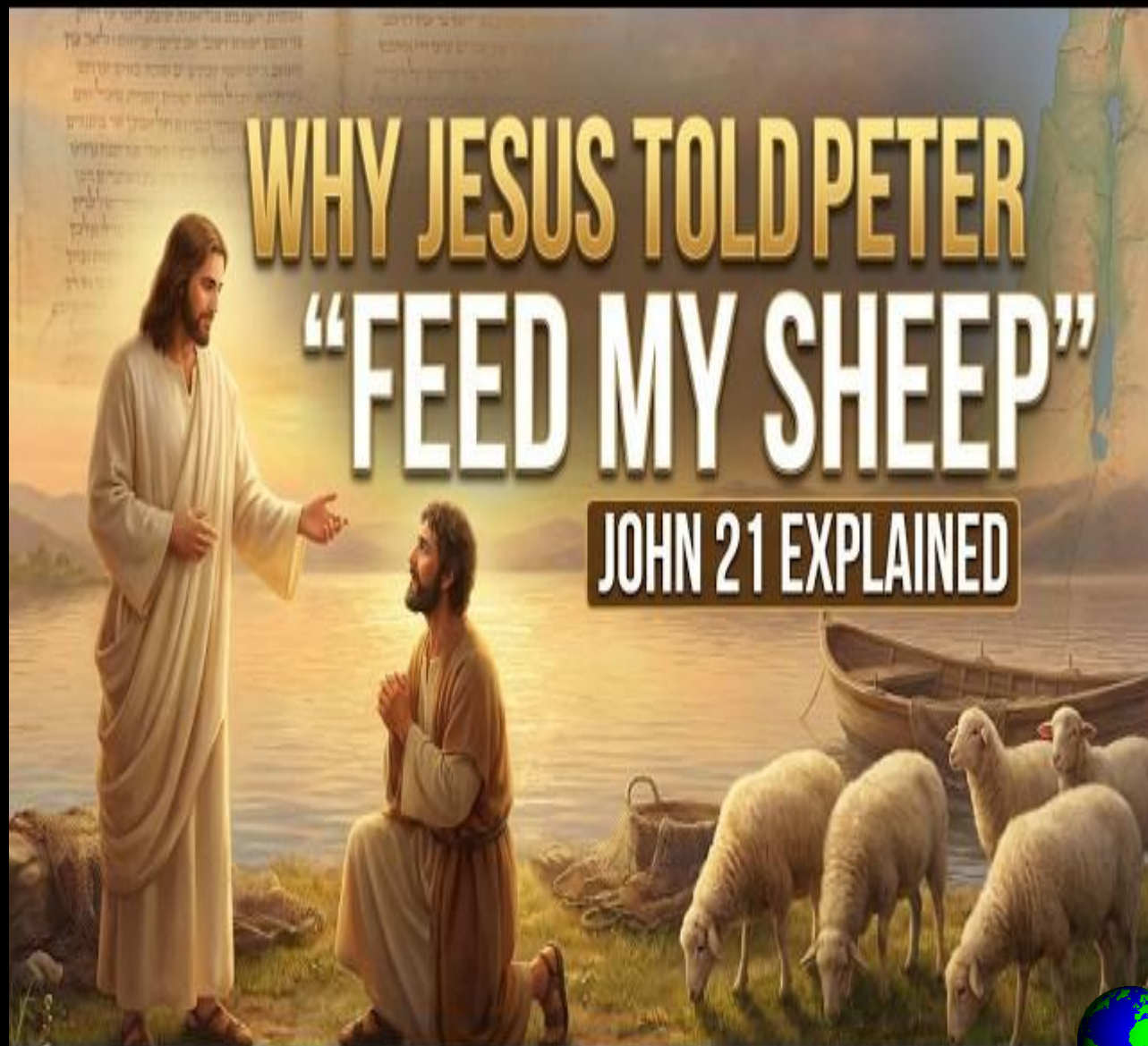
John 18 & 19: These chapters cover the trials, Peter's denial, and the crucifixion. The cross is the ultimate vindication of God's character, dismantling Satan's accusations against the law.



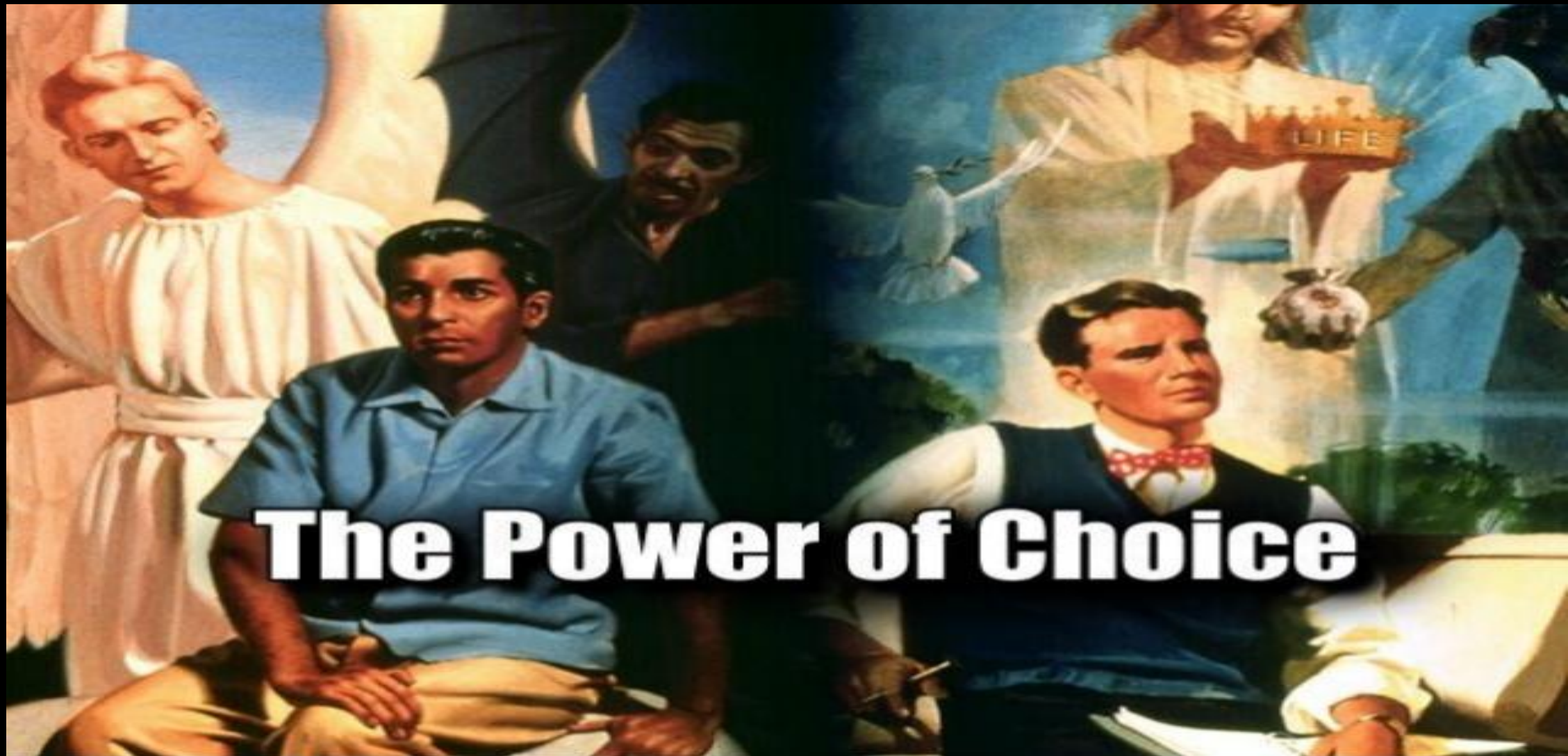
Conclusion

John 20: The resurrection on the first day of the week validates Christ's divinity, establishing the Sabbath's counterpart in the Gospel and securing the promise of eternal life.

John 21: The restoration of Peter demonstrates the endless grace of Christ, emphasizing the Great Commission to "feed my sheep" and the necessity of personal devotion.

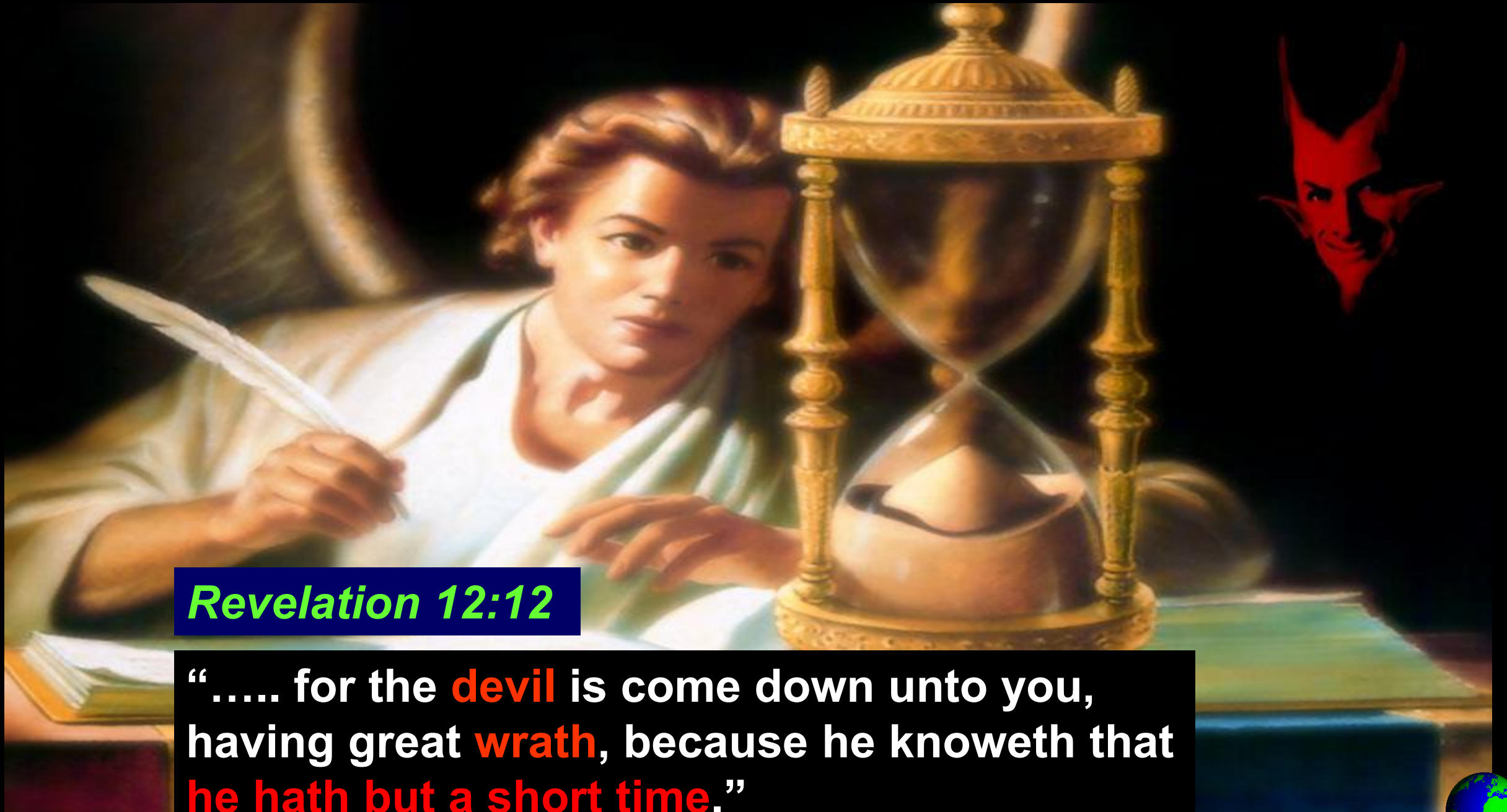

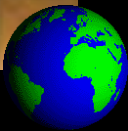

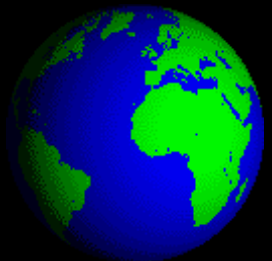
