Health Snippet – Bilberry

Health Benefits of Bilberry (Seek Medical Advice)

Bilberry (*Vaccinium myrtillus*) is a low-growing deciduous shrub, closely related to the American blueberry. Its dark-blue berries feature pink-red flesh. Health benefits of Bilberry:

Eye Health: Frequently used to support vision, reduce eye fatigue, and protect the blood vessels in the eyes.

Blood Sugar Regulation: Anthocyanins and glucoquinine help lower blood sugar and increase insulin sensitivity.

Heart Health: Promotes circulation and may reduce LDL (bad) cholesterol while raising HDL (good) cholesterol.

Reduced Inflammation: High antioxidant levels help fight free radicals, reducing oxidative stress and chronic inflammation.

Improve brain function: Powdered bilberry are linked to improve memory in older adults.

May kill bacteria: may have antimicrobial effects against certain potentially harmful bacteria.

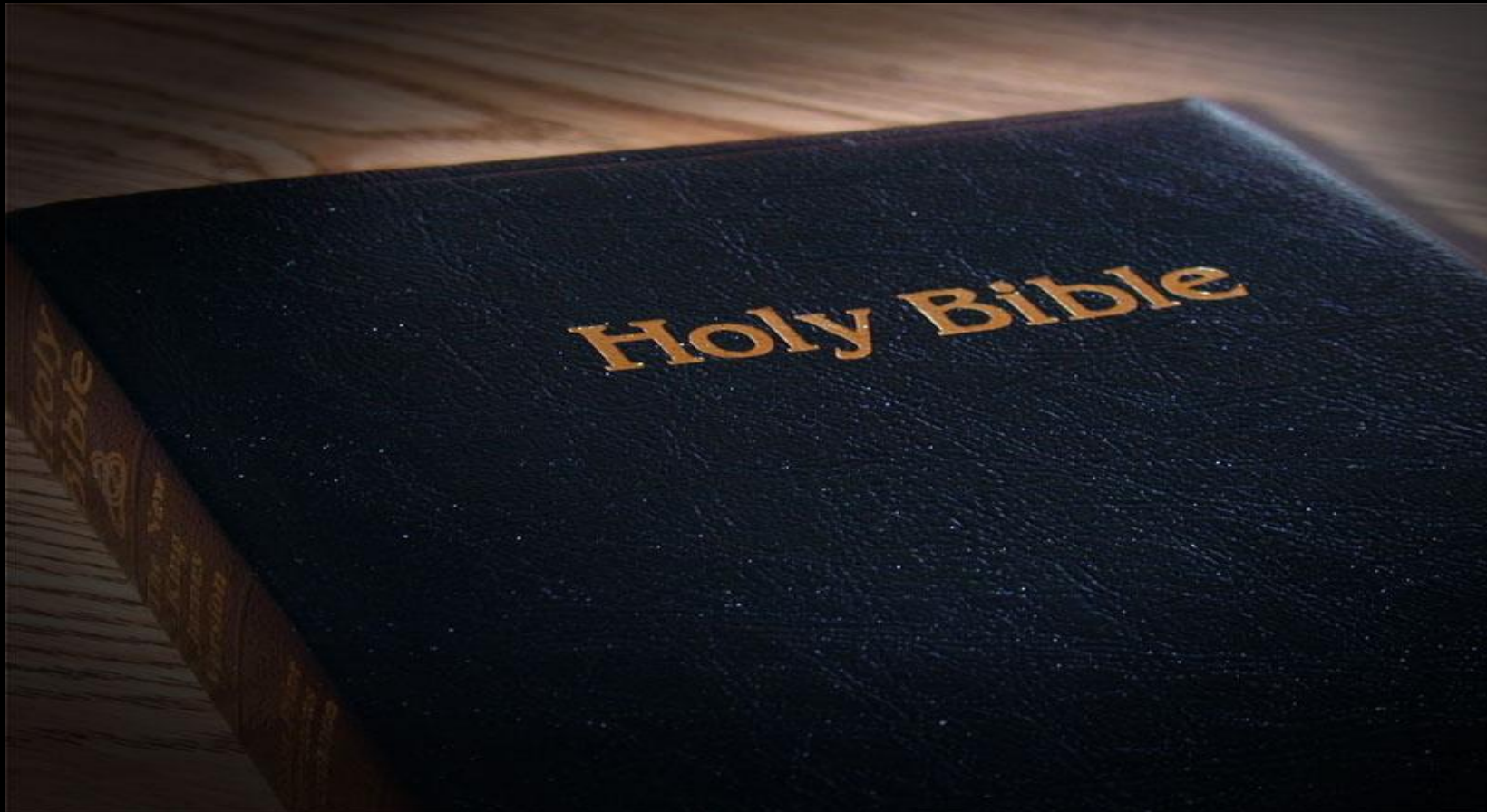
Supplement help reduce chronic inflammation of the colon and rectum in people with UC.

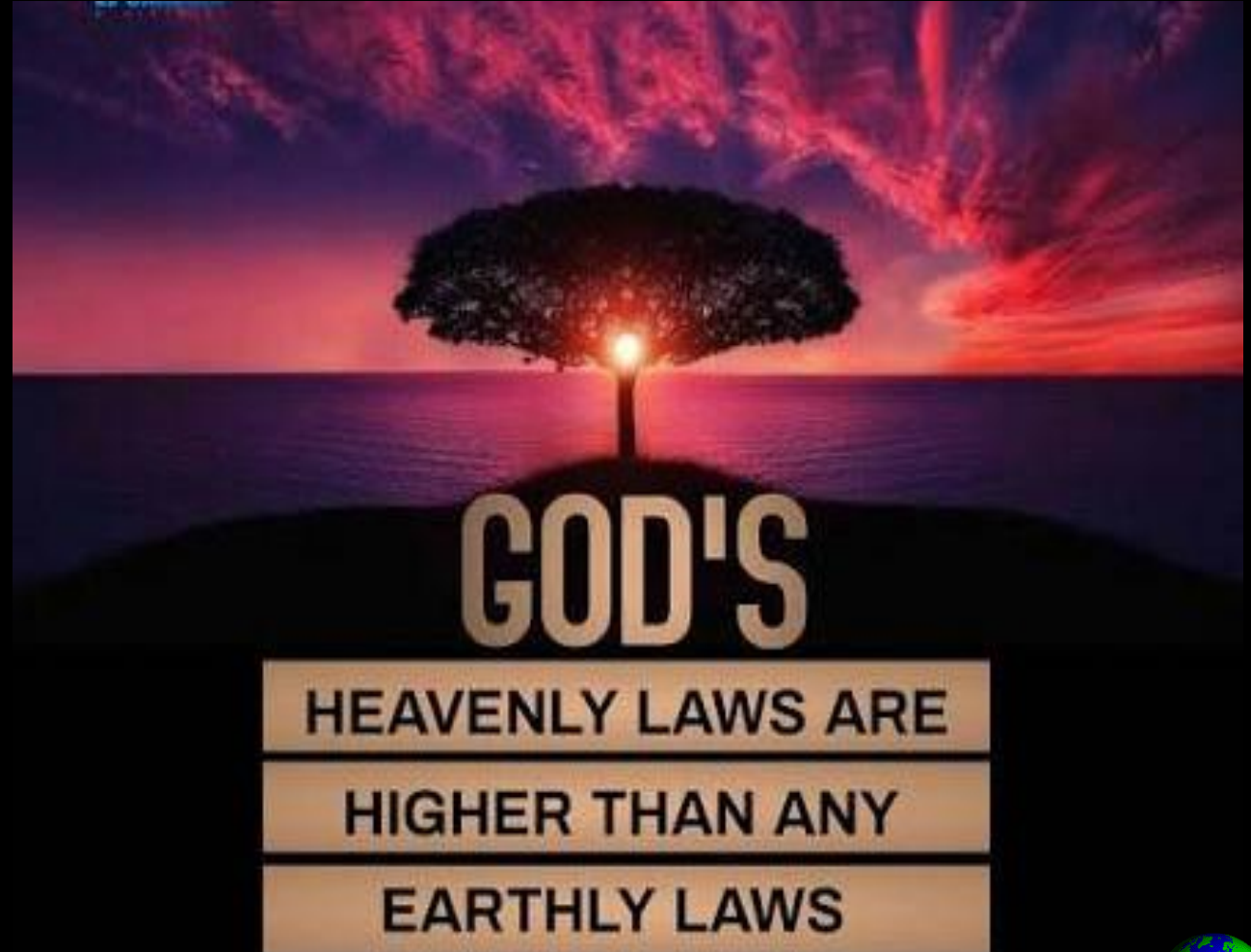


Introduction

1. The Human Dilemma (Romans 1-3)

Universal Sin: All people, both Gentiles (who lack the written law) and Jews (who have it), have sinned and fall short of God's standards.

The Role of the Law: The law is holy, but its function is merely to reveal sin, not to save us. Morality and religious heritage cannot reconcile us with God.



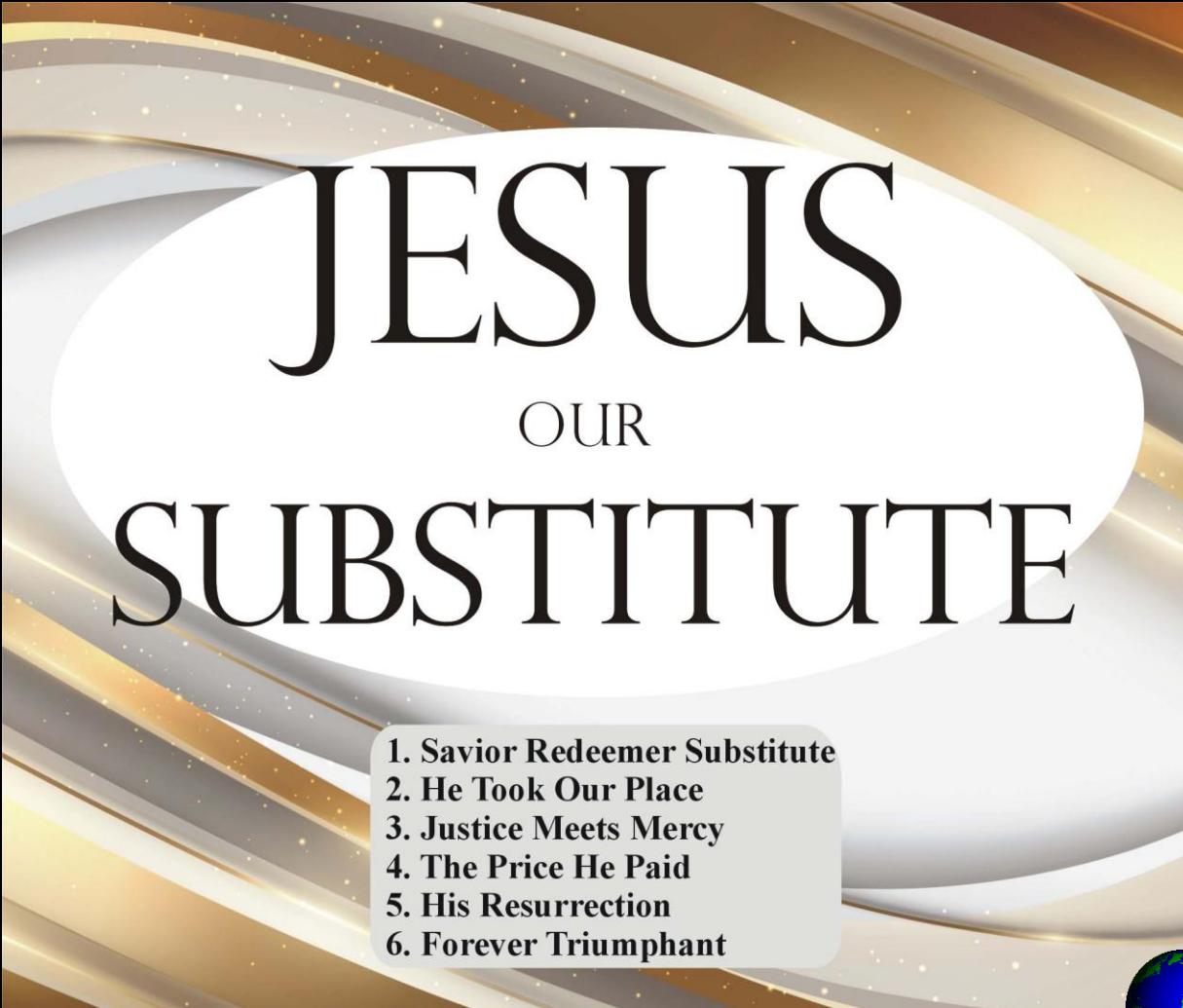
Introduction

2. Justification by Faith (Romans 3-5)

Righteousness as a Gift: God declares sinners righteous strictly as a free gift through the sacrificial death of Jesus.

Christ Our Substitute: Adventists emphasize the Righteousness of Christ, which is both forensic (God legally declaring the believer righteous) and transforming (imparted to the believer).

The Example of Abraham: Justification comes through faith alone, apart from the works of the law, mirroring how God saved Abraham.

Introduction

3. Freedom from the Power of Sin (Romans 6)

Dead to Sin: Salvation by grace does not grant permission to continue sinning. Believers have died to the control of sin (symbolized by baptism) and are now freed to live a life of righteousness.

Sanctification: Grace not only forgives the past but empowers the believer to live a new life.

Introduction

4. *The Struggle of the Flesh vs. The Spirit (Romans 7-8)*

The Conflict: Chapter 7 describes the painful, ongoing struggle of a person trying to keep the law in their own human strength—the flesh. The law is good, but human nature is weak.

Victory in Christ: Chapter 8 begins with the victorious declaration of "no condemnation" for those in Christ.

The Empowering Spirit: The Holy Spirit dwells within believers, giving them the power to overcome the sinful nature and enabling them to live in harmony with God's law.

Romans 1: The Human Predicament

The Universal Need: Paul introduces the gospel as God's power for salvation. He explains that both Gentiles (who rejected the visible witness of creation) and humanity at large have turned to idolatry and are lost without God.

Romans 2: The Failure of the Law

No Room for Boasting:

Paul addresses the moralist and the Jew. He explains that simply possessing God's law or religious privileges (like Sabbath-keeping or baptism) does not save anyone. Sin is an issue of the heart, not just external compliance.

Do Not DISCREDIT THE NAME OF THE LORD

You who boast in the law
do you dishonor God

Romans 3: God's Solution in Christ

Justification by Faith:

Concluding that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God," Paul pivots to the good news. Salvation is a free gift. God's righteousness is credited to believers through Christ's atoning sacrifice, proving God is both "just and the justifier".

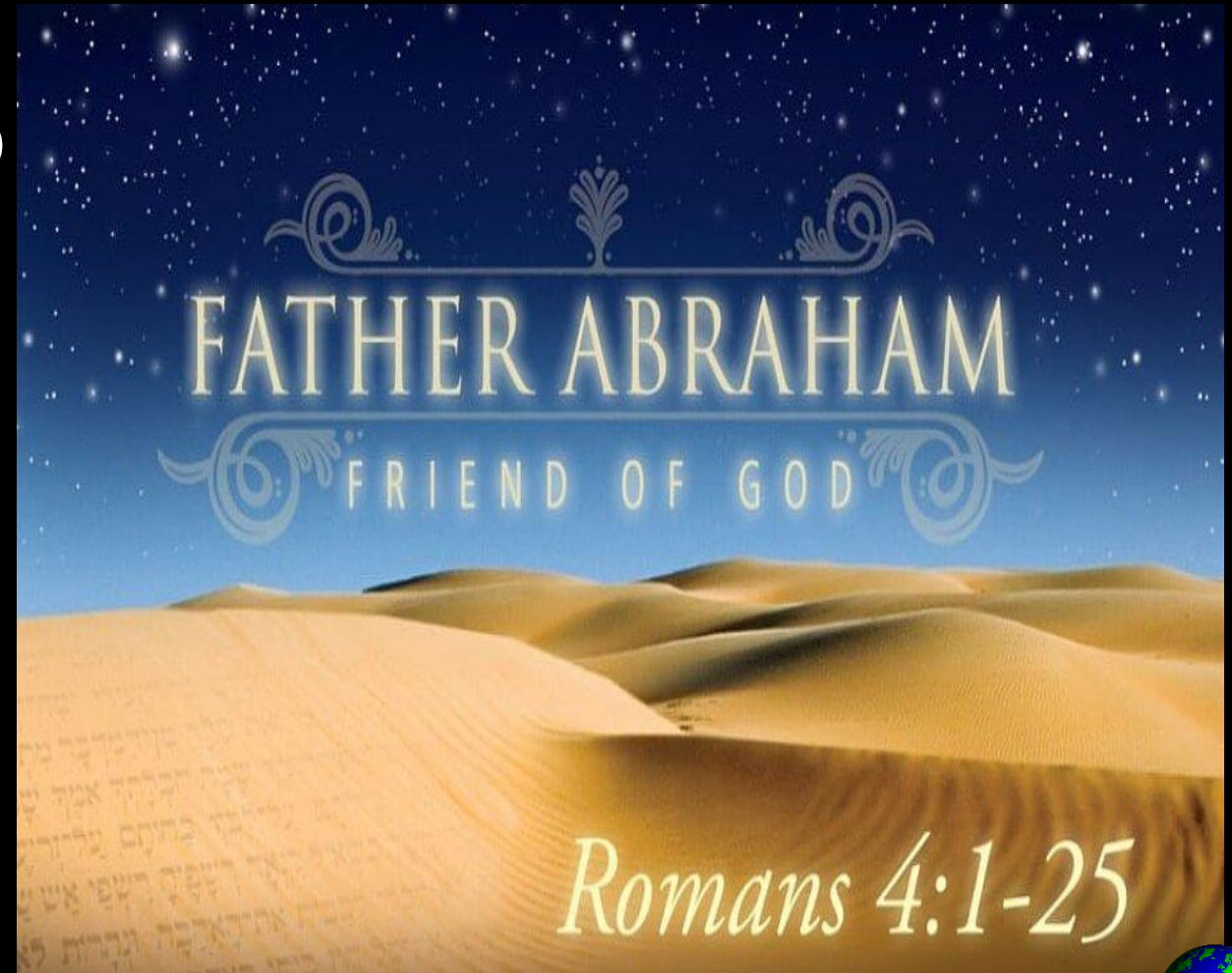

Romans 4: Abraham's Faith

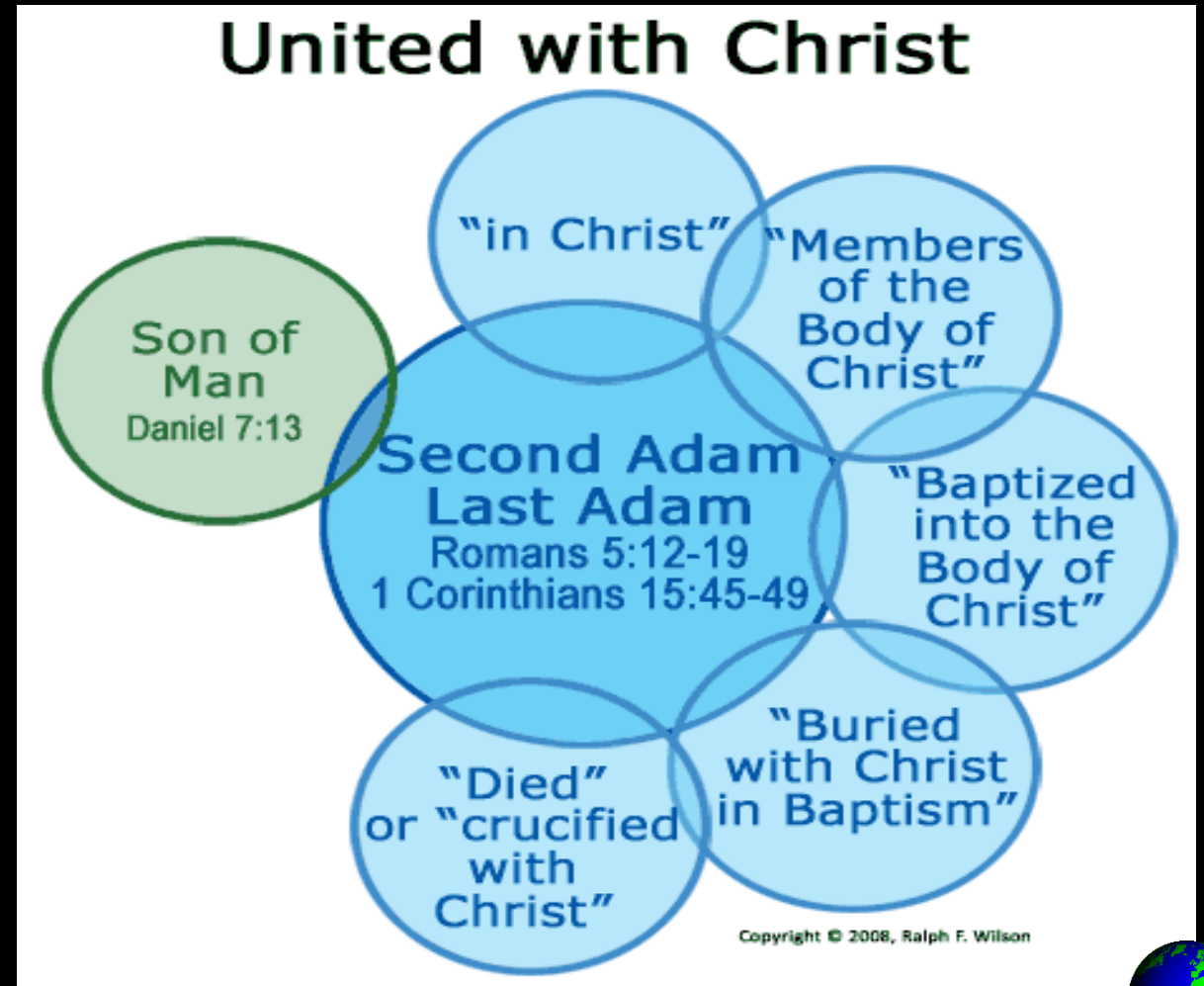
Righteousness by Faith Alone: Paul points back to the Old Testament. Abraham was justified by faith before he was circumcised. This establishes that salvation is not earned through works of the law, but is accepted by trust in God.

Romans 5: Peace and the Two Adams

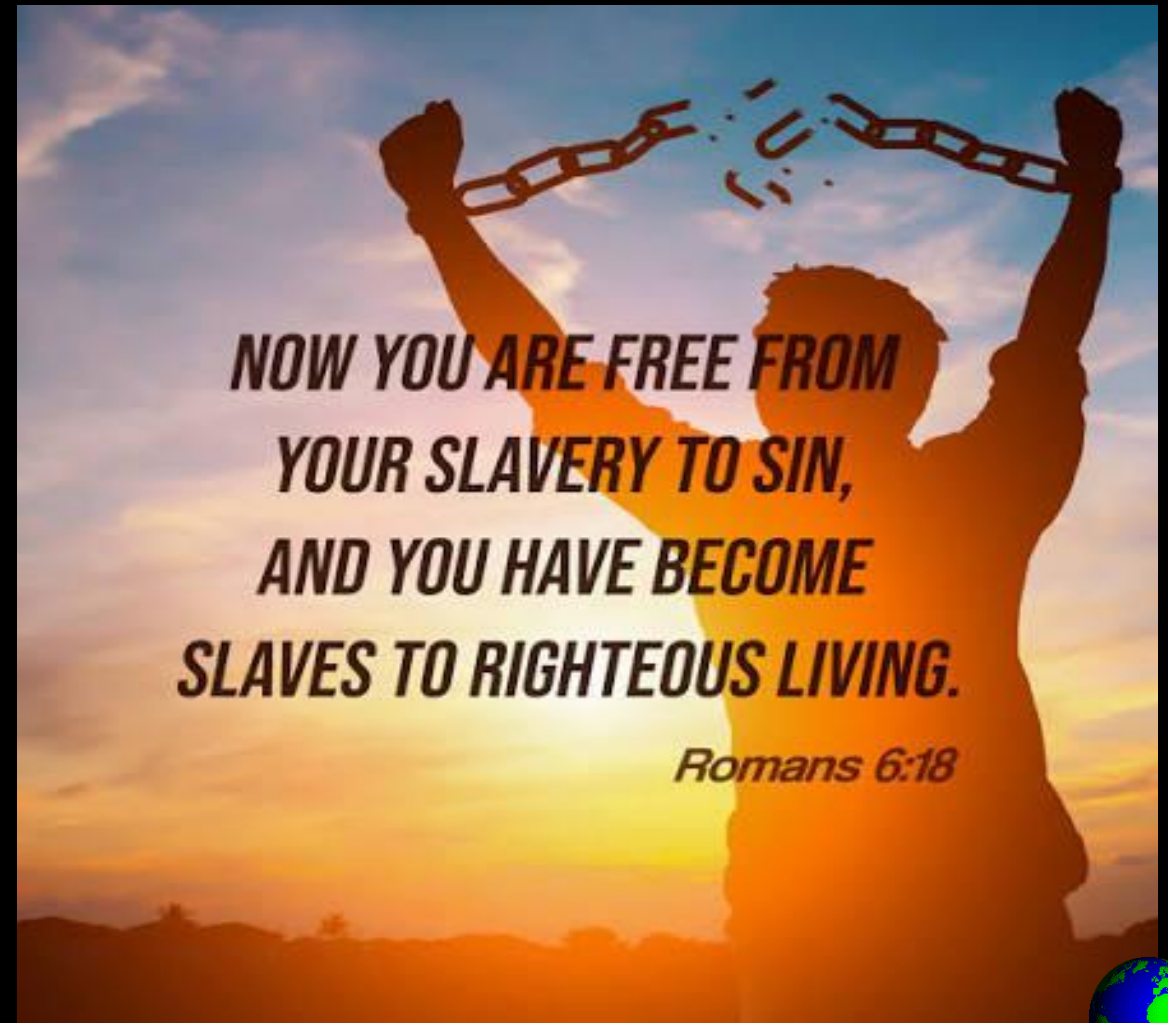
Reconciliation: Being justified by faith brings peace with God. Paul then draws a parallel between Adam (who brought sin and death) and Jesus (who brought grace and eternal life). Christ's grace is vastly greater than the damage caused by Adam.



3 - Lessons in the book of Romans

Romans 6: Freedom from Sin's Slavery

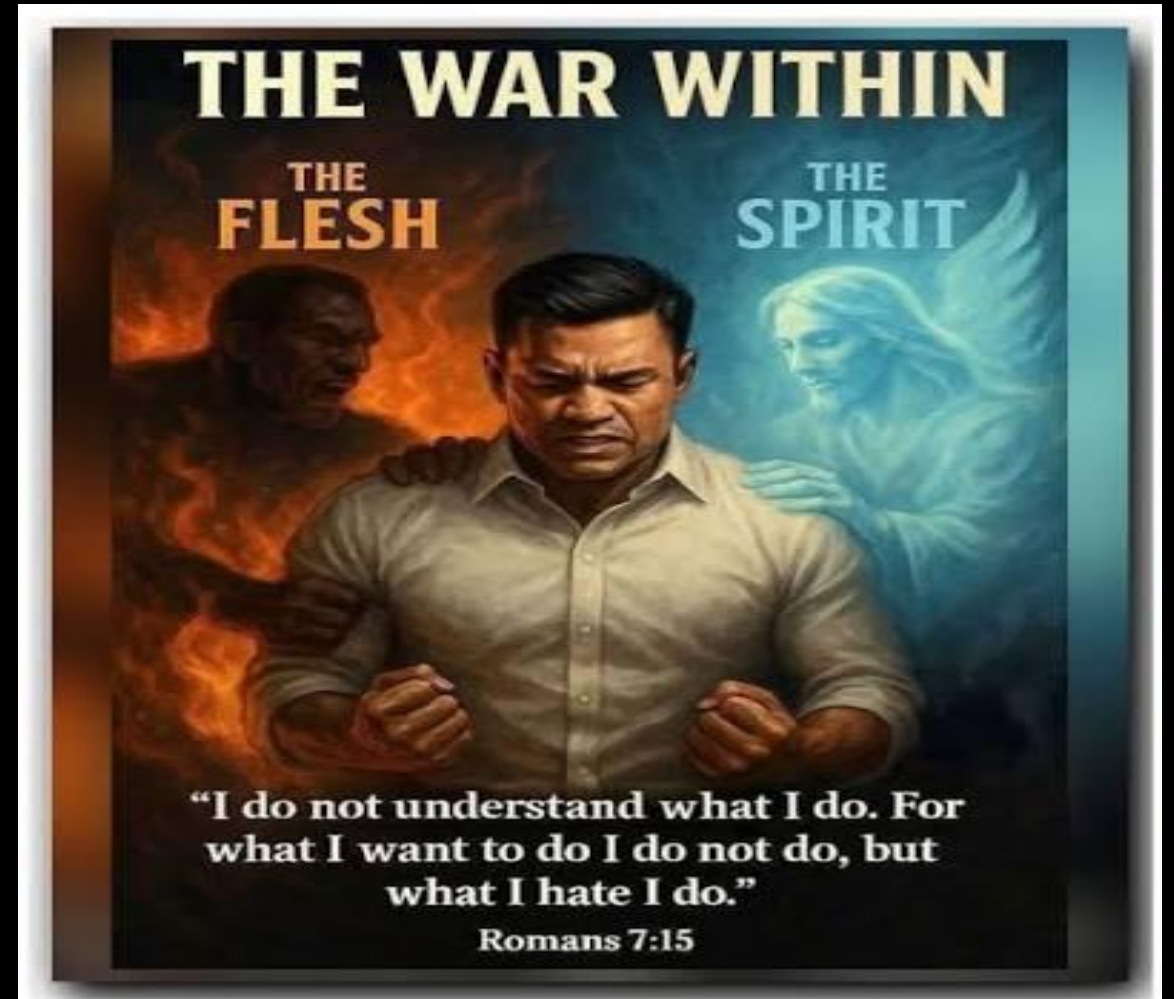
Grace is Not a License to Sin:
Paul asks, "Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound?" and answers with a resounding "No!". Baptism symbolizes the death of the old self and rising to walk in newness of life. Believers are called to yield themselves as instruments of righteousness, no longer slaves to sin.

Romans 7: The Struggle with the Flesh

The Law's Purpose: Paul clarifies that the law of God is "holy, righteous, and good". Its purpose is to expose sin, not to save us. He vividly describes the internal conflict every believer faces: the desire to do good but the inability to do so in one's own human strength.



Conclusion

Romans 8: Life in the Spirit

No Condemnation: Chapter

8 is the climax of Paul's argument. There is "no condemnation" for those who are in Christ Jesus. The indwelling Holy Spirit empowers believers to overcome the "flesh," gives assurance of adoption into God's family, and reminds them that current sufferings are nothing compared to future glory.

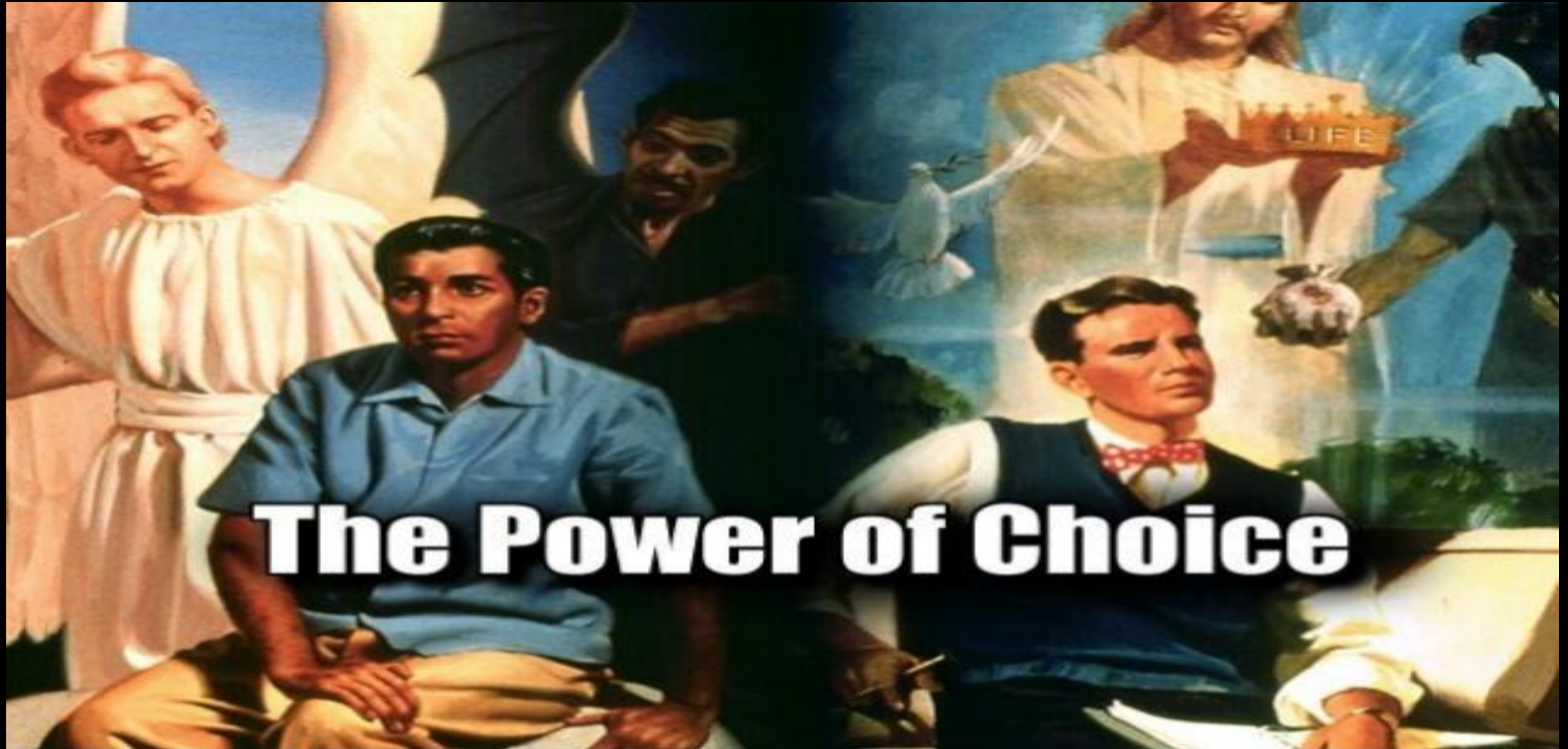

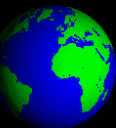
